## PROCLAMATION OF A LOCAL STATE OF EMERGENCY PURSUANT TO EXECUTIVE LAW – SECTION 24

**WHEREAS**, in order to address the threat that gun violence poses to the health and welfare of the City of Rochester's residents and visitors, I previously proclaimed a Local State of Emergency on July 21, 2022; and renewed the same approximately every 30 days thereafter, most recently on April 11, 2024 and;

WHEREAS, the City of Rochester continues to see unacceptable levels of gun violence; and

**WHEREAS**, as of May 10, 2024, there have been 69 shooting victims in calendar year 2024, 289 shooting victims in 2023 and 339 shooting victims in 2022; and

**WHEREAS**, as of May 10, 2024, there have been 20 City homicides in calendar year 2024, 58 homicides in 2023, and 76 homicides in 2022;

**NOW, THEREFORE**, I, Malik D. Evans, Mayor of the City of Rochester, New York, pursuant to the powers granted me under New York State Executive Law Section 24 hereby **continue the previously proclaimed local State of Emergency** throughout the City of Rochester due to gun violence. **This State of Emergency shall continue for 30 days from the date that it is executed**.

This **Proclamation of a Local State of Emergency** shall be published in the local paper and publicized by an announcement over not less than two radio or television stations within normal operating range of the City.
