- Noise, dust and vibrations may cause adverse impacts to the adjacent residents. Construction and demolition operational specifications should be presented to the City for review and inspection.

- Where feasible, the drainage conditions should be improved. The Commission agrees that the use of gravel for parking areas rather than asphalt is preferrable.
- 2. Demolition debris should be disposed of appropriately.

- **A. Port EIS** The DEIS preparation is in the final stages. A DEIS is expected in July.
- B. Durand Beach Master Plan DEIS underway.
- **C. Wegmans East Ave** –The REC prepared the following recommendation:

The proposed project should be approved with the following conditions:

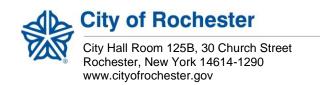
1. At the locations where pedestrians cross the main vehicle access drive running north and south through the parking lot, a raised crosswalk with striping should be installed for safety.

- 2. A cart return should be installed in the westernmost portion of the parking lot to reduce the number of times pedestrians must cross the path of vehicles.
- 3. The proposed "Pharmacy" sign over the bottle return door is confusing because it does not relate to the location of the pharmacy inside the building. Wegmans should consider removing that sign.
- 4. The floor plan shows three bays on the northwest end of the proposed building, but the west elevations show two bays. This needs to be reconciled.
- 5. Any use of LED signs at the corner of East Avenue and Winton Road should be limited as they would be too distracting to drivers at this busy intersection.
- 6. A non-static (i.e., has movement, activity) greenspace should be designed at the corner of East Avenue and Winton Road that includes a water feature, benches and appropriate lighting that is not distracting to drivers.
- 7. While we appreciate Wegmans' branding through references to an agricultural theme, the simulated "barn doors" (EIFS upper floor façade feature) are too divergent from the neighborhood context. The "barn doors" should be clear glass windows. If the "barn doors" must remain in some respect, then, along the west façade only, Wegmans could develop these doors as wood or cement board with "hay loft" elements, including typical door hardware to make them look more authentic. The East Avenue façade, however, should not have the "barn doors" at all.

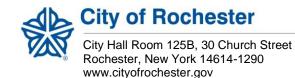

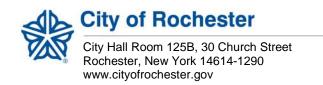
