SUBSTANTIAL AMENDMENTS TO THE CITY OF ROCHESTER'S

CONSOLIDATED COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT PLAN/2017-18 AND 2022-23 ANNUAL ACTION PLANS

In accordance with the federal regulations at 24 CFR § 91.320, and the City of Rochester's Citizen Participation Plan, the City is in the process of substantially amending two prior Annual Action Plan documents that guide its use of funds for the 2017-18 and 2022-23 program years from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Community Development and Planning Program.

The Consolidated Planning process is a requirement for direct financial assistance under certain HUD formula grant programs including the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program, the HOME Investment Partnerships (HOME) programs, the Emergency Solutions Grants (ESG) program, and the Housing Opportunities for Persons with AIDS (HOPWA) program.

Changes:

The City is proposing to amend the two prior plans to reallocate funding between existing projects as follows:

Rationale:

The amendments are being proposed to facilitate timely spending of the grant funds before they expire. The Homeownership Assistance Program for Vacant Houses project encountered significant challenges identifying properties that fit the program scope. The Project Phoenix program could not meet federal eligibility requirements associated with CDBG funding.
