## **Discussion**

- Kevin: seems like this one area should be rising to the top. Could you explain why it wouldn't be?
  - "School 33"/Sully Branch Library/Ryan Center, "School 12"
- Yixuan: how did you narrow down focus areas?
  - Jake: areas around high-ridership bus stops. In addition, areas near highest PUDO RTS Access addresses
  - Concern about if the bus data is comprehensive enough. We know that a lot of households in the north rely on public transit

- Elizabeth: Can we add the BG/Tract where the census data was joined from
- Yixuan: Can we share the bike network so we can ensure it aligns with the MC ATP
- Elizabeth: Can we share where there's bike/ped overlap?
- Jesse: Continuous miles of high-comfort bike facilities for performance measures
  - Recognizing the difficulties of measuring connectivity
    - Elizabeth: Add miles of connected network as additional measure
- Elizabeth: ADA Transition Plan metric
- Elizabeth: Questions about accounting for mode share
  - will mostly rely on GTC models, which tend to be most reliable
- Mike B: Create engagement strategy to ensure youth/older adults/etc. are specifically included in the outreach for Ped Focus Areas
