Is it hard to apply for SNAP?

Not at all. Application forms are shorter and simpler. You can even submit an application online yourself or at your local NOEP's office. Most SNAP applicants have their interview over the phone rather than having to go in to Social Services.

How do I use SNAP?

Using SNAP is easy and discreet. Just shop for your food, go to the checkout, swipe your SNAP card, enter your PIN, and whatever amount isn't covered by your SNAP benefit, you pay for yourself.

Where can I use SNAP?

You can use SNAP at any participating business, including, but not limited to, supermarkets, dollar stores, convenience stores, farmer's markets, and co-ops. SNAP helps bring federal dollars into your community.

- Help you complete and submit the application.
- Help you gather, copy, and submit the supporting paperwork that you need to apply for SNAP.
- Inform you of your rights as a SNAP applicant, and advocate on your behalf to ensure your rights are being met according to SNAP regulations.
