About Our Program

The Do The Right Thing Award Program has been part of the Rochester Police Department since 1995.

The goal of the program is to foster positive relationships between local area law enforcement and the youth within Monroe County. The Do The Right Thing Award Program recognizes children for their positive behavior, accomplishments, and good deeds by rewarding students who strive to make good choices, do well in school, give back to their communities, or demonstrate "turn-around" or improved behavior. Any student enrolled in grades Kindergarten - 12 in any school within Monroe County is eligible for nomination, and can be nominated for acts of courage and bravery, such as assisting first responders, as well as acts of volunteerism, leadership and role model behavior. Students may be nominated for incidents that have occurred within one year of the nomination, and within Monroe county.

Anyone over 18 years old can nominate a student (this includes first responders, teachers, coaches, family, friends, etc.). Nominations are accepted throughout the year, and are reviewed by a committee that selects students to receive the Do The Right Thing Award. Selected students are celebrated at a ceremony at the City Public Safety Building. Ceremonies are held during the school year, and family and friends are welcome to attend. All ceremonies are also recorded and shared on Facebook, so you'll never have to worry about missing a ceremony, and you can always go back and watch past recorded ceremonies as many times as you'd like!

Program sponsors, and winners may also apply for a college or trade school scholarship when they are high school seniors. Since the program began, we have received over 4,000 nominations, awarded over 1,100 winners, and contributed over \$100,000 towards scholarships for our winners. Students selected as winners must attend an award ceremony in order to officially be considered a Do The Right Thing winner, unless the ceremony is held virtually. All students that are nominated will receive a letter of recognition for their act, even if they are not chosen as a winner.

Each ceremony and the winners are highlighted in the media, courtesy of program sponsor News 10NBC WHEC-TV. Stories are televised on WHEC and highlighted on-line as well. Visit their website at WHEC.com to view past highlights.

2023 Do The Right Thing/The Summit Federal Credit Union Scholarship

Each year, all previous Do The Right Thing Award winners that are currently high school seniors may apply for a scholarship to be applied towards the payment of their college or trade school tuition and/or acceptable. A selection committee reviews all applications, and the number of winners selected each acceptable with the amount of program funding available. Since 1997 our program has award 112 acceptable. In attendance to present each winner were Do The Right Thing Executive Board President James McCauley, and three representatives from The Summit Federal Credit Union - Dawn Kellogg, Public Relations and Community Engagement Specialist, Twanda Christensen, Vice President of Marketing and Community Engagement and Jessica Williams, Main/Winton Branch Manager (she is also a Do The Right Thing Board of Director). Both winners were each awarded a \$2000 college contacts of Scholarship (\$1000 from DTRT and \$1000 form The Summit FCU).
