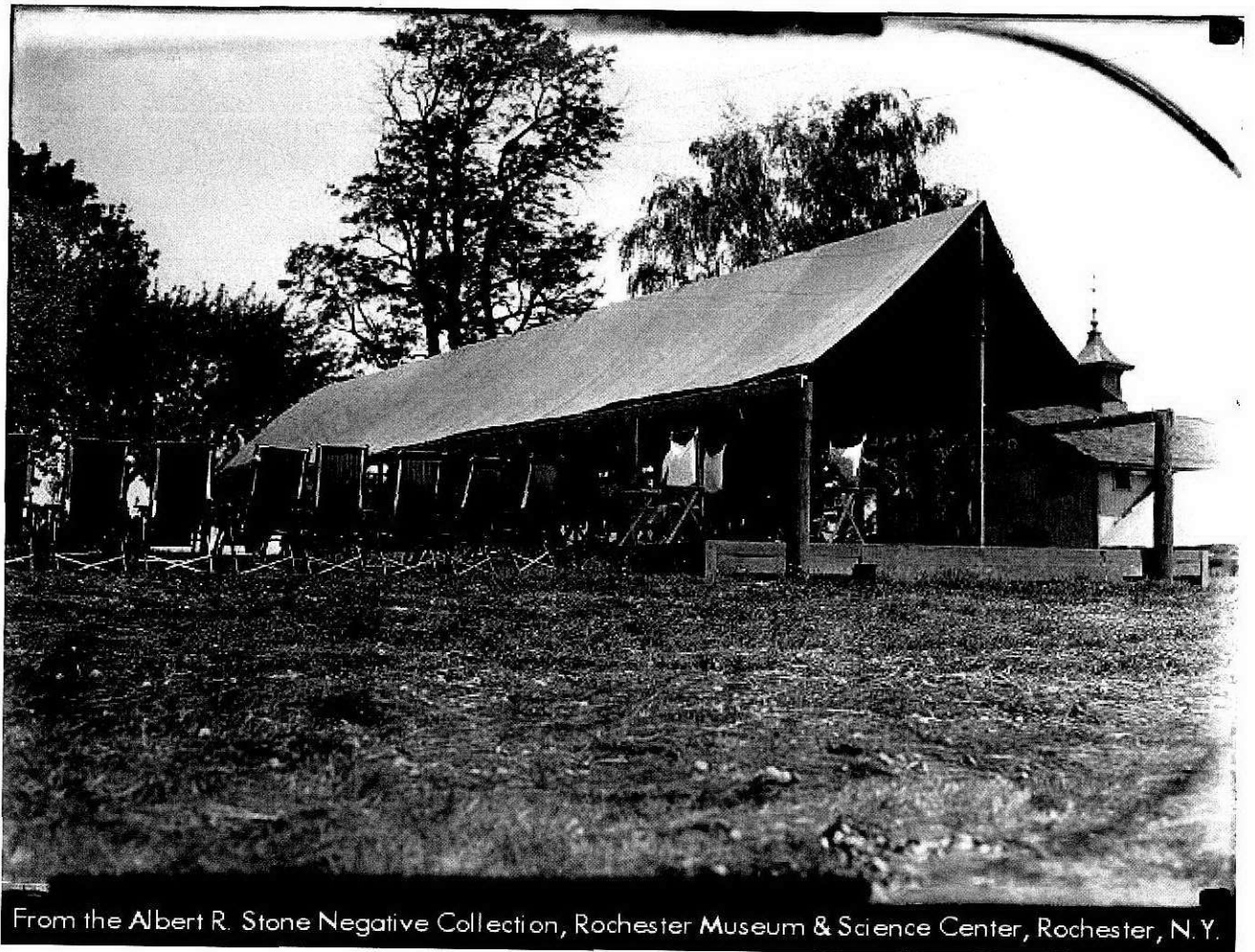


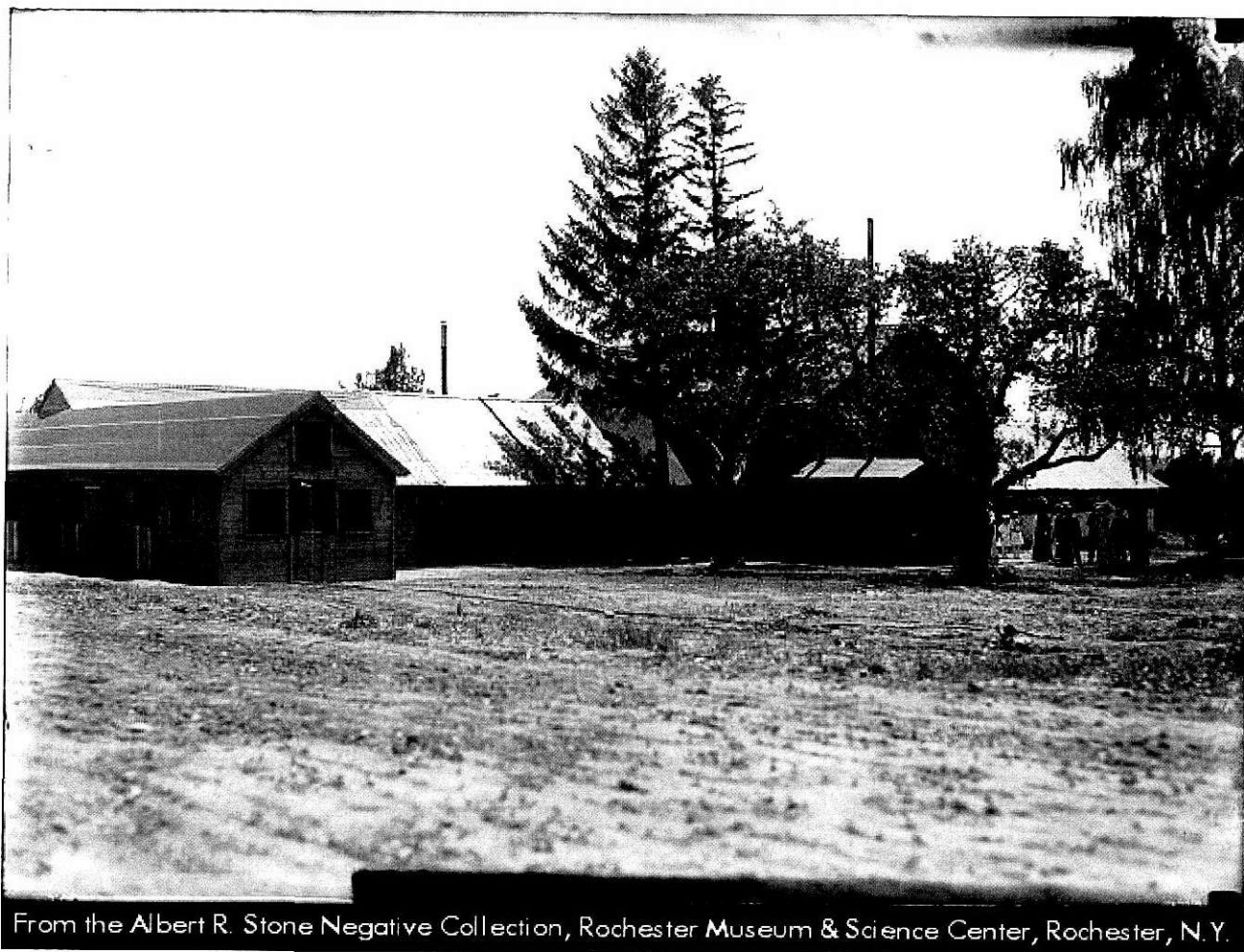

At right is a group of people preparing to raise the flag for Memorial Day services. The two little girls dressed in white are Josephine Koeppler and Lillian M. Tegg.
