For 21 years, "Head of the Genesee" Regatta" has been the flagship of River Romance Weekend. Originally the brainchild of former University of Rochester Vice-President George Angle, Corn Hill Navigation founder Ted Curtis and others, the Regatta was managed by the University of Rochester and RIT. Two years ago a new not-for-profit, Rochester Community Rowing, Inc. was formed to expand reach beyond the collegiate community and to return surplus profits directly to the rowing community to help grow programs and participation.

This year's event, held at the Genesee Waterways Center, will feature Scholastic, Open and Masters racing on Saturday. Competitive rowers from high schoolers, Olymipic caliber and old timers (masters) can be viewed along the banks of the Genesee.

On Sunday the college crews compete in a unique format of distance racing in the morning (5000 meters) and sprint racing in the afternoon (1500 meters). Awards are based on a combined time for the crews.

This year the event is expected to attract over 300 entries. Regatta Director, Tim Giarrusso said, "Our goal is to grow this event every year and continue the long tradition of excellence that our predecessors have created. Rochester has a great reputation for rowing and a pair or premier rowing venues in the Genesee River and The Erie Canal. We want to continue that long proud tradition of rowing in Rochester and help grow the sport." The event is scheduled from 9 am-4 pm each day. Public viewing is available in Genesee Valley Park east access from Moore Rd.
