







Genesee Valley Olmsted Firm Canal RR Co. master plan lays tracks on the completed old Genesee Valley Canal on west bank of river

Rochester Athletic Club first club given permission to construct a club house or boat house on the west bank

Water Carnivals begin annually in summer

Private parcels of land (former hotel sites) just south of the South Plymouth intersection become dedicated parkland

Outer Loop highway completed with flyover bridge relieving traffic on Elmwood Avenue

City of Rochester creates Parks Commission which hires Olmsted Firm as landscape brings residents into architect

South Park renamed Genesee Valley Park; Plymouth trolley line the park

Recreation facilities opened on west bank, including swimming pool, ballfields, refectory and track

New canal opens combining water with Genesee River; River waters raise 12 feet & flooding increases dramatically

Interstate 390 bisects the park near the barge canal; No landscape architect was consulted to ease the changes
