The container holding the body is placed in a specially designed combustion chamber called a retort where the cremation process occurs. The retort is heated to 1,850 degrees Fahrenheit. It takes between 1-1/2 to 3 hours to complete. At the end of the process, the bone fragments are taken out of the retort and placed in a machine called a cremulator which reduces the bone fragments to a uniform size. Depending on the size of the body, there are approximately six to nine pounds of bone fragments left after the cremation. The cremated remains are then placed in an urn or temporary container and returned to the funeral director or family.






