

Public Tour of South Section ofMount Hope Cemetery

Every Saturday at 11:00 am beginning May 4 through October 12.

Admission \$5 per person. Members and children under 16 free.

Meet: Cemetery Office, South entrance opposite the Distillery restaurant.

The tour consists of a two hour leisurely walk through the south section covering approximately 1–1½ miles on paved roads and even terrain. Learn about 19th and 20th century Rochesterians including Rufus Sibley co-founder of Sibley, Lindsay, and Curr department store, Frank Gannett, founder of the Democrat and Chronicle, James Vick founder of Vicks Nursery, and others.


Mother's Day Special
