

CITY OF ROCHESTER



Whereas:	The majority of all homicides in the United States of America, New York State and the City of Rochester are perpetrated with a gun and victims who survive shootings very often suffer irreversible consequences, both physically and mentally, that forever alter the course of their lives; and
WHEREAS:	In the year 2012 alone, 26 of 36 homicide victims in Rochester were victims of gun violence, which represented an increase of 86 percent over the previous year. In the year 2012 alone there were 218 shooting victims in Rochester, which represented a 52 percent increase over the previous year; and
WHEREAS:	Most gun violence occurs in urban areas such as Rochester that are already coping with a disproportionate share of the ill effects of poverty, including inadequate education systems and inadequate employment opportunities, and gun violence greatly perpetuates the negative cycle of poverty; and
WHEREAS:	The victims of gun violence are not limited to those who are shot. Every homicide and every shooting affects the lives of countless numbers of family members and friends of the men, women and children who are shot, and the pain and grief suffered by these family members and friends is beyond measure; and
WHEREAS:	Bringing awareness to gun violence is an important step to ending it and most gun violence occurs in the summer months beginning in June

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Thomas S. Richards, Mayor of the City of Rochester, New York, do hereby proclaim June, 2013 to be:

GUN VIOLENCE AWARENESS MONTH
