


SUMMINE TO explore the neighborhoods

For 175 years, Mount Hope
Cemetery has provided its visitors
with a peaceful oasis set within
an inspirational landscape. At the
heart of this serene environment are
the majestic trees. Unfortunately,
time and weather conditions have
impacted the health of many of
these aging trees and left them
in need of replacement. Join the

Landmark Society of Western New York: Formed in 1937, a decade before the founding of the National Trust for Historic Preservation, LSWNY hosts a House & Garden Tour, Inside Downtown, Walk the Walk and Ghost Walk. 546-7029. www.landmarksociety.org

Friends of Mount Hope Cemetery: In 1838 Mount Hope Cemetery was dedicated, becoming the first municipal Victorian cemetery in the United States. Volunteers conduct public and theme tours starting May 8 and concluding on August 14. 461-3494. www.fomh.org

Friends of Washington Grove: Named after the nation's first president, Washington Grove is a 26-acre old growth oakhickory forest on glacial terrain on the eastern edge of Cobbs Hill Reservoir. The land was acquired by the City of Rochester in 1908 through a combination of City funding and private donations. In 2009 a draft management plan was submitted to the City. Since then volunteers have worked with the City to maintain a healthy representation of common native plants, control nonnative invasive species, maintain trails and replant appropriate plants as needed. In 2013 the informal group registered as a New York non-profit as The Friends of Washington Grove, Inc. in collaboration with the City, The Friends have developed a work plan for 2014 that includes tree planting, invasive removal and trail maintenance.

Family Walks in Washington Grove

Nestled behind the reservoir atop Cobbs Hill is a beautiful grove of native giants, commemorated as Washington Grove after our first President. The Friends of Washington Grove, Inc., a small community nonprofit, is collaborating with the City to protect and restore the Grove and increase knowledge about its ecology. For these walks, meet on the east side of the reservoir, where street parking begins on the one-way circle around the reservoir. 234-1056.

Birding with Washington Grove.
Saturday, May 3, 8 to 9:30 a.m.
Washington Grove is a way-station for migratory birds and year-round home to many others. On good days, the mix of species can be amazing and the chorus of songs thrilling. If you are experienced, or new to

birding, join veteran birder Pat Martin to spot and identify some of these beautiful creatures and thrill to their spring songs. Adults and children 10 and older. Children must be accompanied by an adult. Binoculars recommended.

Washington Grove: Geology, Ecology and Restoration. Saturday June 7, 10 to 11:30 a.m. Learn about Washington Grove's old growth forest, its underlying geology and the restoration projects maintaining its majestic appearance.

Fun with Fungi. Saturday, August 9, 10 to 11:30 a.m. They may make your feet itch, rot your house, and make food taste awful, but fungi are amazing helpers that are essential to the ecosystem. Learn about many different species in Washington Grove. (Please Note: this walk will be postponed till Sunday.

Aug. 10, 1 to 2:30 p.m. if there are thunderstorms or high winds).

Fall Foliage in the Grove. Saturday, October 18, 10 to 11:30 a.m. Washington Grove is a beautiful place to visit in any season. Come to the Grove for an appreciation of ancient and younger trees in their colorful glory as the seasons change.

2014 Schedule Guided Bicycle Tours

Seneca and Turning Point Parks:

June 3. Meet at Seneca Park Zoo parking lot. We cross over to the west side of the Genesee River to ride on the Genesee Riverway Trail north to the Port of Rochester. Spectacular views of the river gorge, ride on the 4,000 foot boardwalk in Turning Point basin, and under the O'Rorke Bridge. A 12-mile ride on a paved trail with a few moderate hills. This ride is repeated during the River Romance Weekend, October 5 at 1 p.m.

High Falls Neighborhood: June 10. Meet at the Pont de Rennes Bridge, behind the Centers at High Falls. Travel along the Genesee Riverway Trail and by road into the community. Ride through downtown Rochester, Genesee Valley Park, Corn Hill,

Susan B. Anthony neighborhood which contains the Frederick Douglass Museum site. A ten-mile ride on flat terrain, city roads and paved trail. This ride is repeated during the River Romance Weekend, October 4 at 1 p.m.

Genesee Valley Park Neighborhood Trails: June 17. Meet at the Genesee Valley Park pool parking lot, 131 Elmwood Ave. Bike on the Erie Canal, Genesee Riverway, Lehigh Valley North and Genesee Valley Greenway Trails. A 12.5-mile ride on flat terrain, payed and unpayed trails.

Mount Hope Cemetery: June 24. Meet at the Waterways Center at Genesee Valley Park, 131 Elmwood Ave. Explore the oldest municipally maintained Victorian cemetery in the United States. This will be a slow ride and walk in Mount Hope Cemetery with many stops. The tour is lead by the Friends of Mount Hope and includes stops at many graves sites of prominent Rochesterians. Ride covers city roads, cemetery trails and some hilly terrain.

South Wedge Neighborhood: July 8. Meet at the Genesee Valley Park pool parking lot, 131 Elmwood Avenue. Bike on the Genesee Riverway Trial and on the bicycle lane on South Ave. in the Wedge, a neighborhood which is enjoying a rebirth with new housing and businesses. An eleven-mile ride on paved trail and city roads.

R Community Bikes Tour and Neighborhood Ride: July 15. Meet at MLK Memorial Park. Explore Downtown and the neighborhood around R Community Bikes by bike, including the Public Market, colorful murals, urban gardens, a neighborhood walking route and a guided tour of R Community Bikes. A 6-mile ride on flat terrain and city roads

University Avenue: July 22. Neighborhood of the Arts and East Ave. Begin at the Rochester Public Market, 280 N. Union Street Ride along University Ave. to view sidewalk art and enjoy the George Eastman House gardens. A 10-mile ride on flat terrain, city roads.

Park Avenue: July 29. Neighborhood and East Avenue. Meet at Towner's Bicycle Shop, 1048 University Avenue. Ride along East Ave. to view the beautiful mansions. A ten-mile ride on city roads, one climb to the top of Cobbs Hill.

Durand Eastman Park and Seabreeze: August 5. Meet at Summerville Genesee River parking lot at the end of St. Paul Boulevard, city roads and one hill climb. Enjoy the beauty of Durand Eastman Beach, Durand Eastman Park and the Sea Breeze Neighborhood. A 10.5-mile ride which includes paved trails.

Charlotte Neighborhood and Lake Ontario State Parkway Trail: August 12. Meet at the Abbott's Charlotte parking lot by Estes Street. Great views of Lake Ontario and the ponds along Edgemere Drive with beach front homes. We will walk a short distance along the Lake Ontario beach front 'secret sidewalk' in front of the beautiful lakeside homes. A 13-mile ride on paved trails and roads.

Corn Hill Neighborhood: August 19. Meet at the Genesee Valley Park pool parking lot, 131 Elmwood Ave. Bike on the Genesee Riverway Trial and explore the Corn Hill neighborhood to view the many historic and stately homes. Approximately a 10-mile ride on paved trail and city roads.

Maplewood Neighborhood: August 26. Meet at the Rose Garden parking lot, Lake Ave. & Driving Park Ave. Ride on the Genesee Riverway Trail through Seneca Park. See the stately homes on Seneca Parkway, close up views of the Lower Falls and the Genesee River Gorge. Ride the new El Camino Trail and across the Rochester Gas & Electric Middle Falls Dam Trail Bridge. A 9-mile ride on a paved trail and city roads with a few moderate hills.

The Roc City Cycling Foundation, in partnership with the City of Rochester, is excited to provide bicycle safety training courses for youth and adults. These training events will be held at various recreation centers and City Parks throughout the spring and summer.

Charlotte Village: June 5, 6 p.m. Meet at the parking lot at the end of Petten Street on the Genesee River. Petten Street runs east off of Lake Ave. This tour will highlight the Charlotte Cemetery, Bill Davis Overlook and the Charlotte Lighthouse. Lower Gorge Explorer walk. (See page 1)


Brooks Landing to Camp Fitz-John Porter Civil War training camp and historic Vacuum Oil Refinery site:
June 12, 6 p.m. Meet at the west end of the pedestrian bridge near Brooks Avenue and Genesee Street. Experience Rochester history from the days of the Iroquois, to the Underground Railroad, and 19th and 20th century industrialism. Sites include Camp Fitz-John Porter memorial site, the Vacuum Oil Refinery buildings, riverfront and beautiful views of the Genesee.

Lower and Middle Falls: June 19, 6 p.m. Meet in the Maplewood Rose Garden Parking Lot, corner of Lake Ave. and Driving Park Ave. Walk the westside of the Genesee Gorge and visit Maplewood Park. Hike also includes former villages of Kelsey's Landing and McCrakenville, as well as the Lower and Middle Falls of the Genesee. Lower Gorge Explorer walk.

Historic Genesee Valley Park:

June 26, 6 p.m. Meet in the south end of the park at the dead end of Hawthorne Drive, close to the East River Road entrance. Genesee Valley Park was designed by Frederick Law Olmsted, and is the junction of a multitude of trails, bike paths and waterways.

Charlotte Lakeshore: July 10, 6 p.m. Meet at Tamarack Street—which runs south off of Beach Avenue. Sights will include Ontario Beach Park and the 'secret sidewalk.' Lower Gorge Explorer walk.



Seneca Park North: July 17, 6 p.m. Meet in Seneca Park, north of the zoo at Trout Pond. Explore the historic Olmsted designed Seneca Park North including: Trout Pond, Aviary and Bandstand and the historic trail system. Lower Gorge Explorer walk.

El Camino Trail: July 24, 6 p.m. Meet at the corner of Clifford Avenue and Conkey Avenue for a hike to the Seneca Park Zoo and back. Rochester's newest trail, initiated by the Genesee Land Trust, follows the former railroad bed through residential and commercial districts.

Highland Park: July 31, 6 p.m. Meet in front of the Lamberton Conservatory. Explore the majestic Frederick Law Olmsted designed Highland Park. Join Tim O'Connell from the Highland Park Conservancy to explore the history, design and preservation of the 1890's section of the park.


Cemeteries along Lake Avenue:

August 7, 6 p.m. Meet at the entrance of Riverside Cemetery. Visit historic Riverside and Holy Sepulchre Cemeteries, including the grave of Rattlesnake Pete. See some of the largest and most beautiful trees in Rochester. Lower Gorge Explorer walk.

Turning Point Park: August 14, 6 p.m. Meet at Boxart Street parking lot. Hike across the picturesque Genesee River board walk and discover the Red Falls Trail and Bullock Woods. Lower Gorge Explorer walk.

Downtown Heritage Trail: August 21, 6 p.m. Meet on the north terrace outside of the Central Library's Rundel Memorial Building, on the corner of Broad and South. Explore the new Rochester Heritage Trail, from the Genesee River west to the Susan B. Anthony Historic District

Historic Corn Hill: August 28, 6 p.m. Meet at the WaterSpirit sculpture on Exchange and Plymouth South. Walk highlights include 18th and 19th Century homes, the city's oldest African American church and historic music venues along Clarissa Street.
