are here to help.



If you are a poor reader, please let me know and I will have a literacy coach contact you. The literacy coach is free and your reading level will always be kept confidential. Coaches will be available at City libraries and recreation centers.

As a way to encourage everyone to read, I started a new program called **Rochester Families Read**. Four times a year, I will give you a book to read to your baby. The book will be available at our libraries and our recreation centers and will be yours for the asking. After reading the book to your baby you can keep it and build your baby's library.

## 2 Take your child to the pediatrician




Those examinations should also include vision and dental screenings. If you need help finding a primary care doctor for your child, let me know and we will link you with a health care provider that you can talk with.



If you are having difficulty preparing meals or making ends meet, we can put you in touch with organizations like FoodLink to help you prepare foods that your baby needs for good growth.



Studies show that 3-year-old children are better off in a high quality learning program than they are staying at home. Subsidies for 3-year-olds have declined over the years. My staff is looking at alternative ways to provide this funding and I am working with the County Executive to ask Albany to restore the subsidies.
