6 A.M. TO 7 P.M.: FALL SALMON RUN

Daily until November for anglers and spectators. Seth Green Drive and Norton Street off St. Paul Blvd. This section of the Genesee River offers some of the most exciting fishing in New York State, right in the city.

BRIDGE. Corner of Platt Street and Brown's Race. A scenic spot to check out amazing local musicians and performers. Donations accepted.


6-8 P.M.: STURGEON EXCURSION ON THE HARBOR TOWN BELLE. Celebrate

the renewed health of the Genesee River with Dr. Jeff Wyatt, sturgeon scientist from Seneca Park Zoo & University of Rochester. The largest project in ROC the Riverway's Phase 1 program, this project will fully reconstruct the deteriorating, inaccessible park and pedestrian bridge north of Main Street. The result will be a greener, more accessible park bringing new life to this section of the riverfront. Construction is anticipated to begin in March 2020.



Reconstruction of the crumbling flood control wall on the west side of the Genesee River between Corn Hill Landing and Ford Street will enhance public views of and access to the river. The end result will be a more welcoming, vibrant riverfront gateway to Downtown. Construction is anticipated to begin in April 2020.



8 A.M.-4:30 P.M.: 30TH ANNUAL HEAD OF THE GENESEE REGATTA.

At the Genesee Waterways Center at 149 Elmwood Avenue. The two-day event is one of New York State's premier rowing regattas and is expected to draw more than 350 racing entries. Ongoing upgrades to the arena will continue with an expansion on the Exchange Boulevard side of the building. The expansion will have new team offices, upgraded locker rooms and an expanded upper level concessions area. This expansion is anticipated to break ground in December 2019. An exciting expansion of the arena's riverfront side is in the planning stages.



Upgrades are coming to High Falls Terrace Park! The existing substandard trail next to the Genesee Brew House will be rebuilt rebuilt to modern standards, better connecting the existing overlook to Pont de Rennes while also improving the walkways through the park. These improvements are anticipated to break ground in summer 2020.

MVP FITNESS COURT AT COBBS HILL

Fitness Courts are outdoor circuit training systems that are designed for adults of all ages and fitness abilities. Rochester is the first community in New York State to have a fitness court, making world-class fitness free for all to enjoy. The Fitness Court is integrated with shock-resistant sports flooring and supports functional fitness movements that allows for up to 28 individuals to use the Court at the same time. As part of an effort to encourage a healthy lifestyle throughout the community, the fitness court will be a pillar of exercise in downtown Rochester.
