



Draft Vision Statement: The West Main Multimodal Transportation and Place-making Plan is a transportation and public realm improvement effort rooted in an inclusive, community-based leadership and decision-making process. The plan will focus on:(1) improving and expanding safety, comfort, and accessibility for people walking, biking, and taking the bus;(2) supporting and fostering sustainable economic activities and opportunities; and(3) celebrating and promoting the history, culture, legacy of surrounding communities.

Based on the vision statement, will this project be what the community needs?



Community Suggestions for Vision Statement

- Try to make it shorter and more succinct
- Directly confront personal security concerns that exist on West Main (people who feel uneasy about panhandling, crime, etc.) as part of (1)
- Incorporate preservation and renovation of historic buildings as part of (3)






Draft Access and Connectivity Goals:

- 1. Provide a high-quality experience for people taking the bus by improving bus stops.
- 2. Provide safe and accessible spaces for pedestrians and bicyclists of all abilities.
- 3. Provide a comfortable walking experience with streetscape improvements including street trees, lighting, benches, and flower boxes.

Do these goals for access and connectivity match the needs of the community?



Community Suggestions for Access and Connectivity Goals

- Be more direct and specific about the strategies
- Incorporate transit service quality in addition to transit access at bus stops
- Incorporate maintenance considerations into goals and solutions (ex. Flower boxes require maintenance, snow clearance impeded all-year access)
- Demonstrate a commitment to preserving access to West Main for people (and potential customers) who pass through but do not live in the area
- Incorporate accommodations for storefront or sidewalk commerce
- Incorporate street buffers to separate fast moving traffic and people on the sidewalk
- Define "high quality experience" for (1) and consider ways to incorporate greenery and play areas around bus stops
- Incorporate slowing down cars as a goal
- Incorporate smart city features




West Main Street // Rochester, NY



Draft Supporting and Fostering Sustainable Community Goals:

- 1. Expand and maintain clean, safe, and accessible sidewalks.
- 2. Find temporary uses for vacant land before it's permanently developed or reused.
- 3. Support existing businesses by expanding existing small business programs and increase local job opportunities through workforce training and development.
- 4. Support and expand high quality affordable housing opportunities and create strong anti-displacement policies before making major investments.



Do these goals for supporting and fostering sustainable community match the needs of the community?

Community Suggestions for Supporting and Fostering Sustainable Communities Goals

- Incorporate incentivizing new employers to locate to the area existing small businesses are critical but only part of the solution.
- Identify potential of vacant land to serve in business0supportive capacities, like parking.
- Make it clear that for businesses to thrive on West Main, more than just local community patronage is important
- Focus on generating the type of businesses that are needed in the community grocery, bakeries, banks, florists, gift shops, etc.
- Add parking goals
- Add a focus on community pride, ownership, and neighborhood morale these will help ensure investments are protected and that deterioration doesn't follow






Draft Celebrating and Promoting History, Culture, and Legacy Goals:

- 1. Empower community organizations and residents to lead the development and implementation of the vision for West Main.
- 2. Acknowledge, promote, and preserve elements of cultural significance including the legacies of Susan B. Anthony, Frederick Douglass, and other leaders while enhancing their relevance for current residents.
- 3. Uplift the neighborhood by funding and promoting creative, community-oriented activities including street murals, sculptures, festivals, and other artistic expressions.

Do these goals for celebrating and promoting history, culture, and legacy match the needs of the community?



Community Suggestions for Existing History, Culture, and Legacy Goals

- Directly confront history of residents and community organizations being ignored
- Incorporate maintenance and renovation of existing historic businesses
- Focus energy on (1) it is the most important
- Look forward, not backward there is plenty that already exists for history, make sure to lift up contemporaries
- Incorporate the need to accommodate visitors to the area as part of promotion – have to have people to promote to




Approach to Ground Truthing Data










Land use regulations on West Main give flexibility to meet a wide range of community needs










Though there is not much completely vacant land on West Main, there are clusters of storefronts available for lease












Some parts of West Main are more active and engaging for pedestrians than others

Some parts of West Main are more active and engaging for pedestrians than others












Along most of West Main, there is no parking or other curbside use permitted on-street

Curbside Uses & Regulations












West Main Street has many historic buildings and displays of public art honoring local culture and leaders
















Transportation Conditions

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People who live around West Main Street have a lower rate of vehicle access than the Citywide average

 On average, 26% of Rochester residents do not have access to a vehicle. In the areas around West Main, 40% of residents do not have access to a vehicle. Car access is not evenly distributed, even with the project study area. North of West Main, car access is higher than the city average, but to the southwest as many as 65% of households do not have access to a car.








Revitalize Rochester Fund Update
