Ladies and Gentlemen:

Re: Federal Grant Application for Emergency Triage, Treat, and Transport (ET3) Model Medical Triage Line

Council Priority: Public Safety

Transmitted herewith for your approval is legislation authorizing the City to submit a federal grant application to the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) seeking a maximum award of \$1,175,000 over a period of two (2) years. The City and its Designee, National Ambulance & Oxygen Service, Inc. d/b/a American Medical Response ("AMR") are seeking the grant to fund the establishment of the 911 Nurse Navigation Program, ("911NN") which will provide alternative care options for low acuity, non-critical calls. The application deadline is May 11, 2021.

911NN will function within the identify clinically appropriate healthcare options for patients calling 911 with low acuity conditions without sending an ambulance, resulting in an overall reduction in healthcare costs associated with ambulance and emergency department use. 911NN will connect patients to sources of care that are local, patient-centric, and able to provide enhanced care continuity via the direction of these calls to a nurse to provide telephonic clinical guidance and care navigation to existing local healthcare resources.

911NN is expected to have the following impacts: 1) Reduce ambulance response to calls likely to be retrospectively deemed medically unnecessary thus saving the ambulance unreimbursed response costs and reserving ambulances for higher acuity requests for service.; 2) Direct the patient to a more medically appropriate treatment location (self-care, referral to urgent care, referral to primary care, etc) instead of a hospital's emergency department; and 3) Reduce healthcare costs and improve care by routing patients to more appropriate sources of care.

Authorizing a grant application for 911 Nurse Navigation Program

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of the City of Rochester as follows:

Section 1. The Mayor is hereby authorized to submit an application to the federal Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services for an Emergency Triage, Treat, and Transport (ET3) Model grant to establish a 911 Nurse Navigation Program for the 911 Center.

Section 2. The application shall contain such terms and conditions as the Mayor deems to be appropriate.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect immediately.
