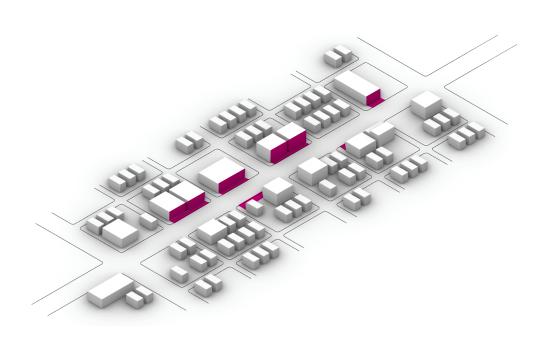

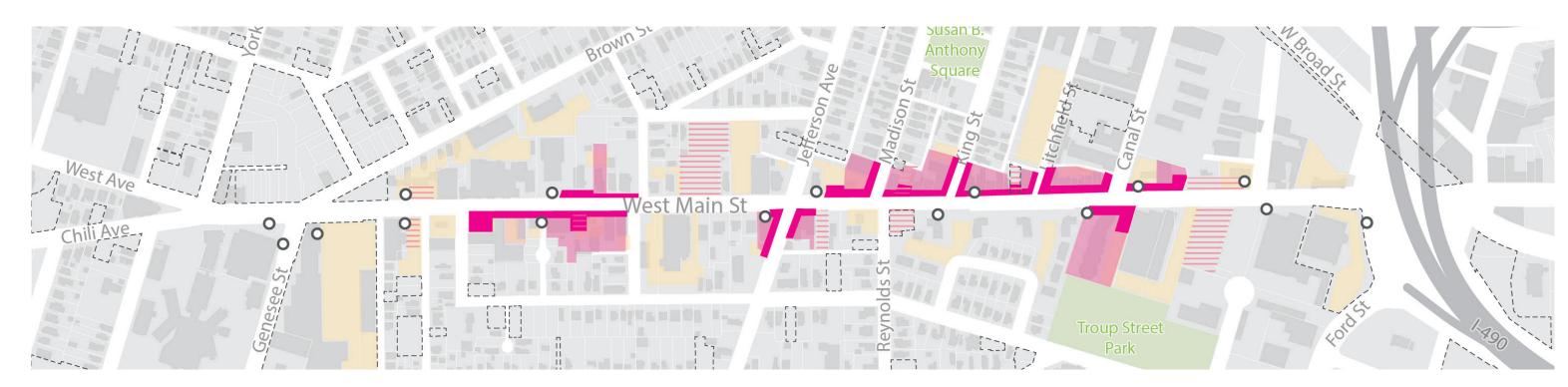
## Storefronts near bus stops

Type of Opportunity - Underutilized commercial storefront and streetscape for activation opportunity

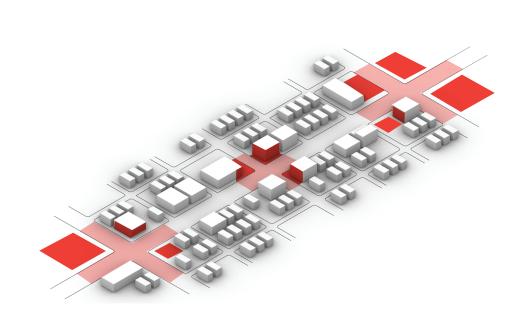
Size - Small to medium



#### Goals

- Provide a high-quality experience for people taking the bus by providing bus stop amenities and supporting reliable transit operations on the street.
- Support local businesses by expanding existing small business programs, increasing local job opportunities through workforce training, and
  incentivizing new employers to locate near Main Street.
- Provide a comfortable, inviting, and well-maintained pedestrian realm through streetscape enhancements including street trees, pedestrian scale lighting, benches, planters, and outdoor spaces for businesses.

Type of Opportunity - Vacant or underutilized land for temporary or longer term activation and programming prior to the development

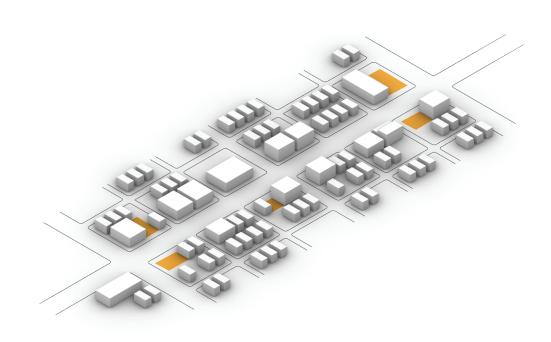
Size - Large

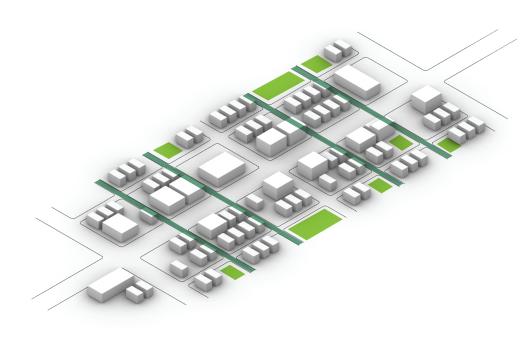

- Shared use sidewalk and bikeway



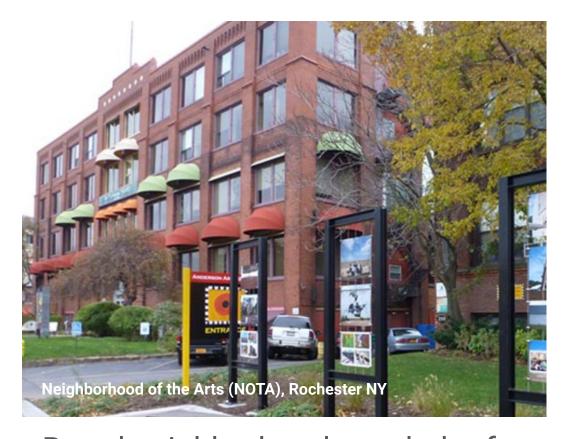
- •Replacing parking spaces with a dynamic public space such as parklet, building trust with neighbors, shop owners, and city official.
- •Expanded sidewalk planting and seating



•Short term bus stop seating improvement that add beautification and brightness to the street landscape with a limited space.



•Improving and maintaining the bus stops and bus stop amenities to enhance the bus rider comfort and also encourage street activity.

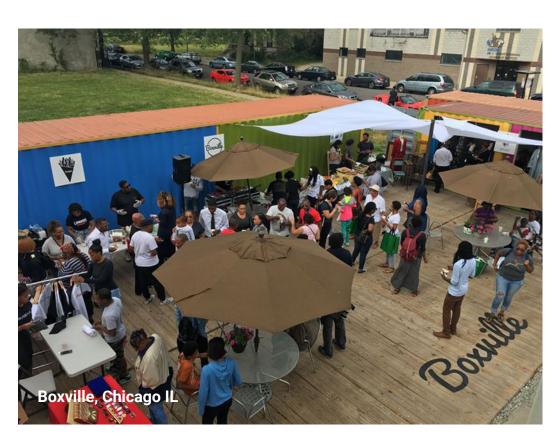
•Activating underutilized area under the highway through lighting and art as a part of promotional campaign to revitalize the neighborhood and activate public spaces.



 Activating the underutilized area by taking lighter and quicker approach by providing seatings and benches where users can sit, relax, and enjoy street life.



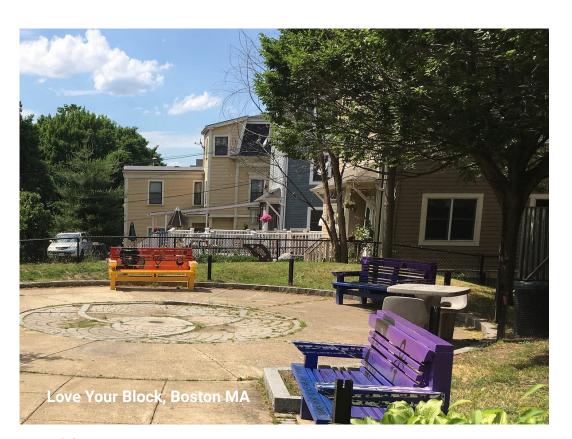
•Temporary, small-scale changes to an urban space that test whether there is need for permanent redesign that could make neighborhoods roads more welcoming for non-vehicular traffic.



•Revitalize the community by providing the broader set of partnerships, resources, and support mechanisms that will facilitate community success.



•Creative placemaking strategy for community-oriented activities and local artists including street murals, sculptures, festivals, and other artistic expressions.



•Offers mini-grants, neighborhood cleanups and eventually community tool sheds for beautification projects to urge Bostonians to revitalize their neighborhoods.



 Neighborhood promotion and activation of vacant spaces with art and culture with public and private partnership and funding.



•Establish and promote permanently affordable, equitable housing, ensuring development without displacement by empowering neighbors, having the community both own and manage land.



•Working with local businesses and communities to renovate a neighborhood alley.



•Public/private coordination strengthening work on urban agriculture, guide the City on how to expand urban agriculture project.



•Resources and Programs to support renters to build financial assets by contributing to and benefit from the management of their apartment communities.
