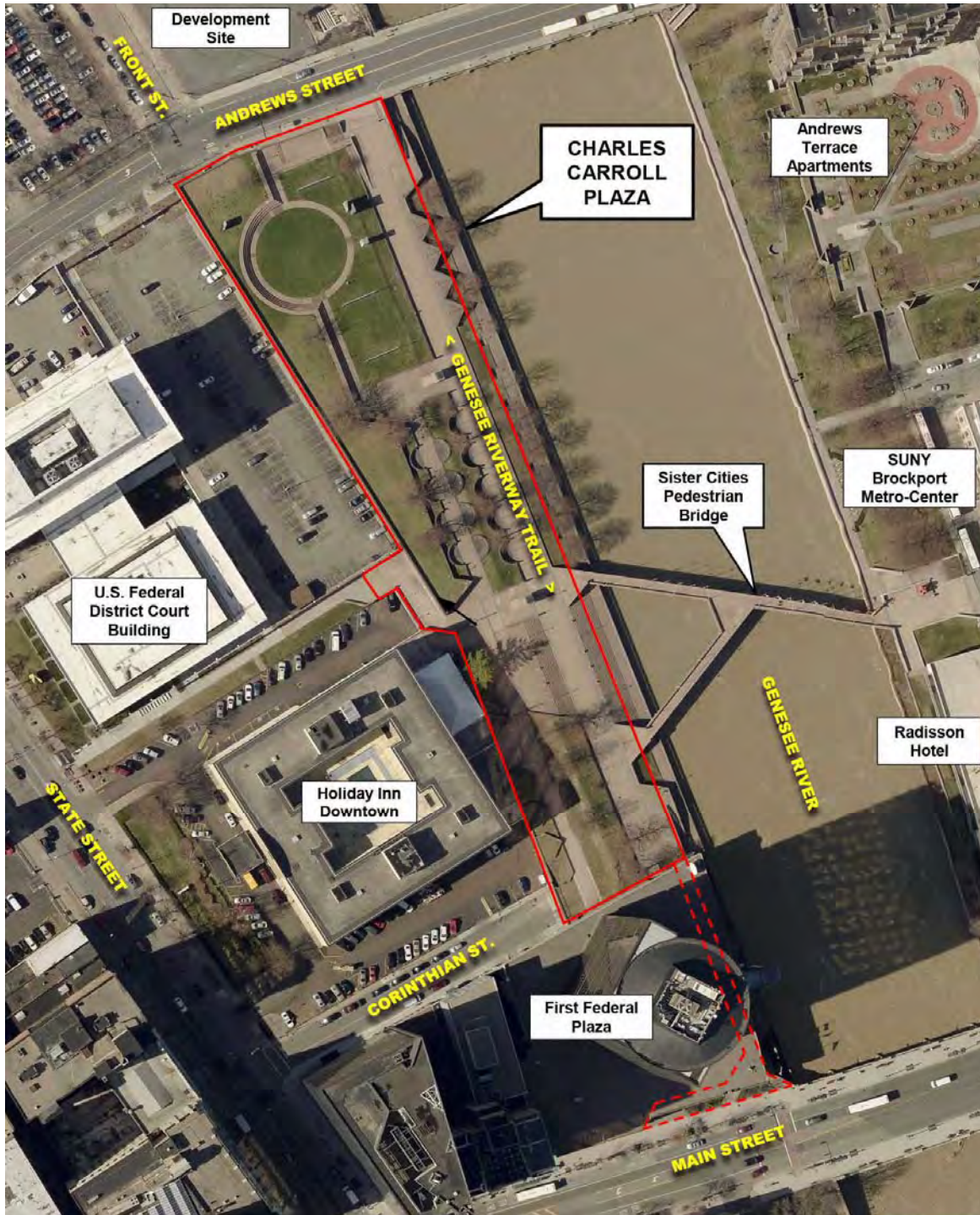

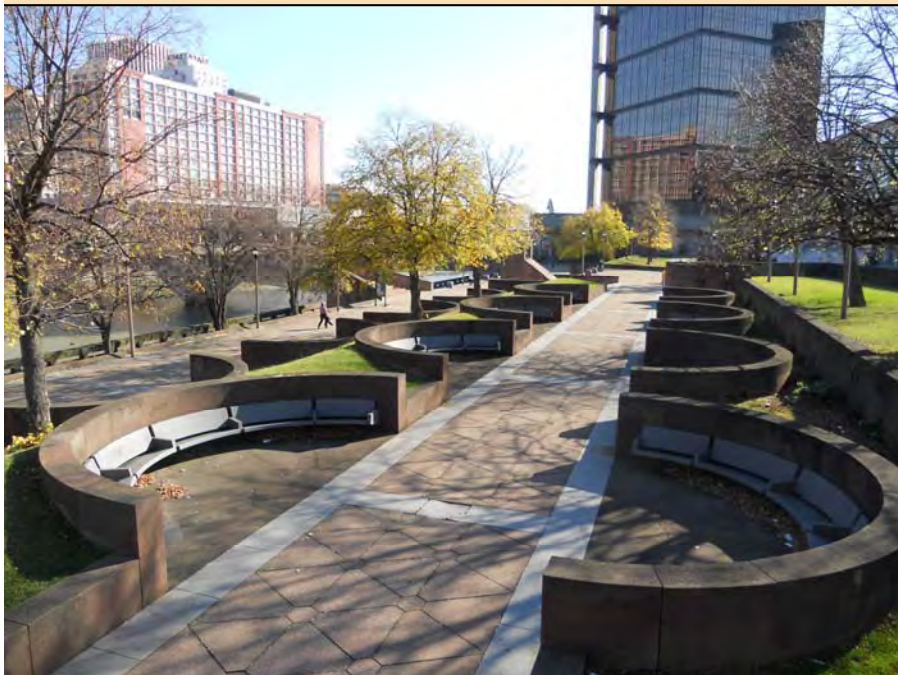

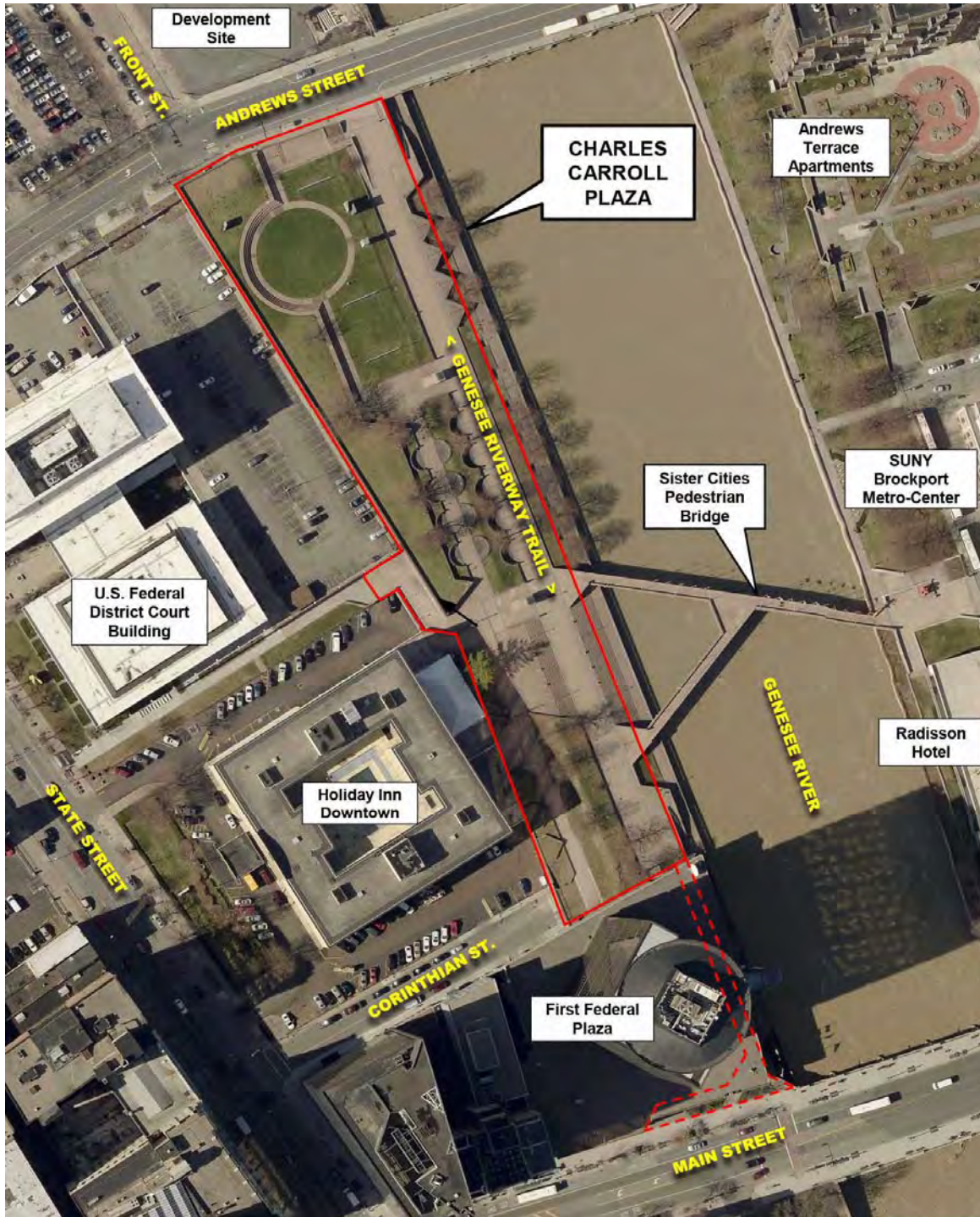

CHARLES CARROLL PLAZA & GENESEE CROSSROADS GARAGE

- ❑ Constructed in 1966
- ❑ Charles Carroll Plaza is a public, river front urban space that provides river views, park seating, a public promenade, landscaping, and green park space.
- ❑ The plaza is approximately 127,000 SF (3.4 Acres) and sits atop of the garage
- ❑ Genesee Crossroads Garage provides 658 critical parking spaces in the heart of Downtown Rochester



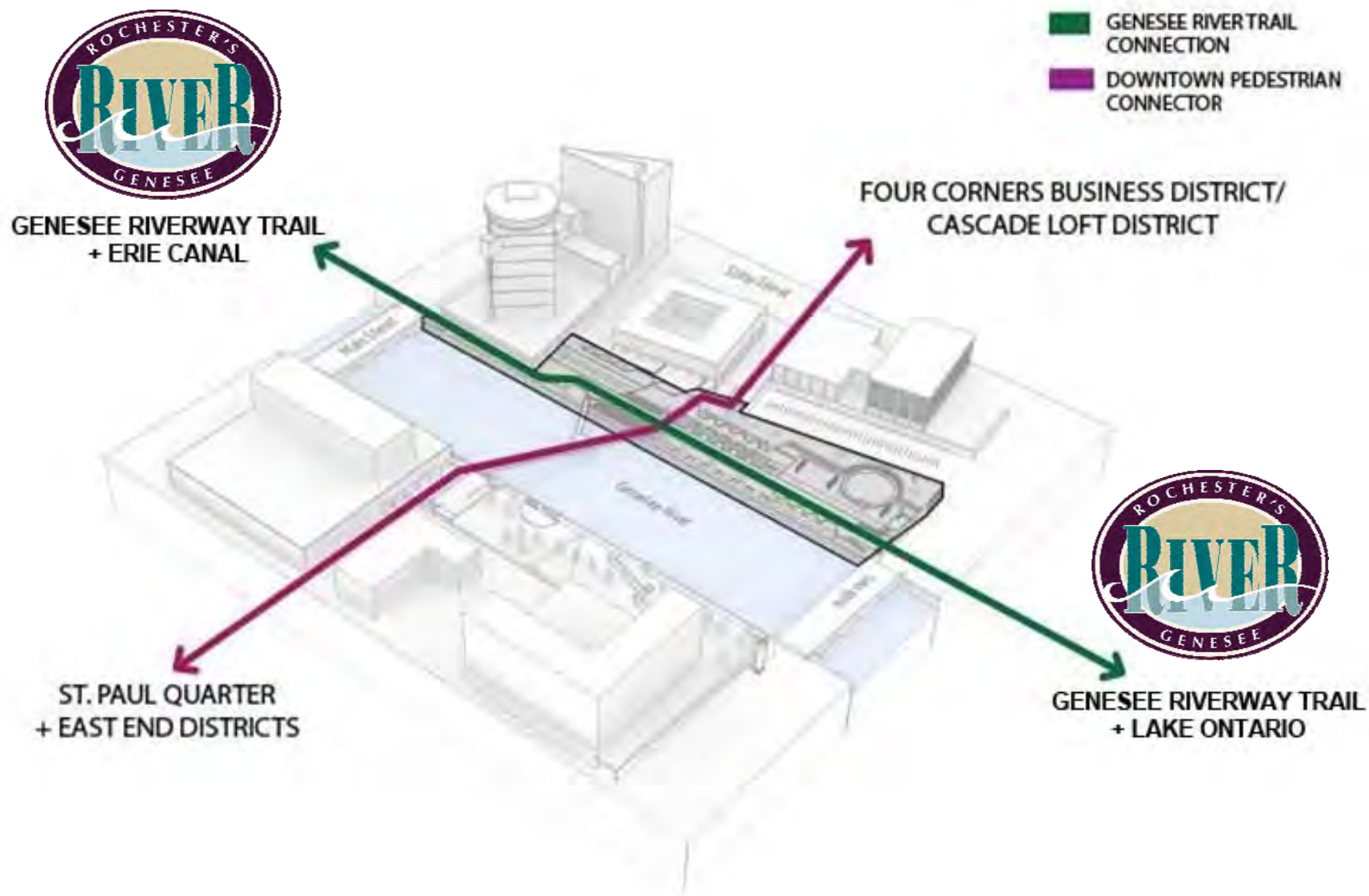


PLAZA'S LOCATION & URBAN CONNECTIVITY:

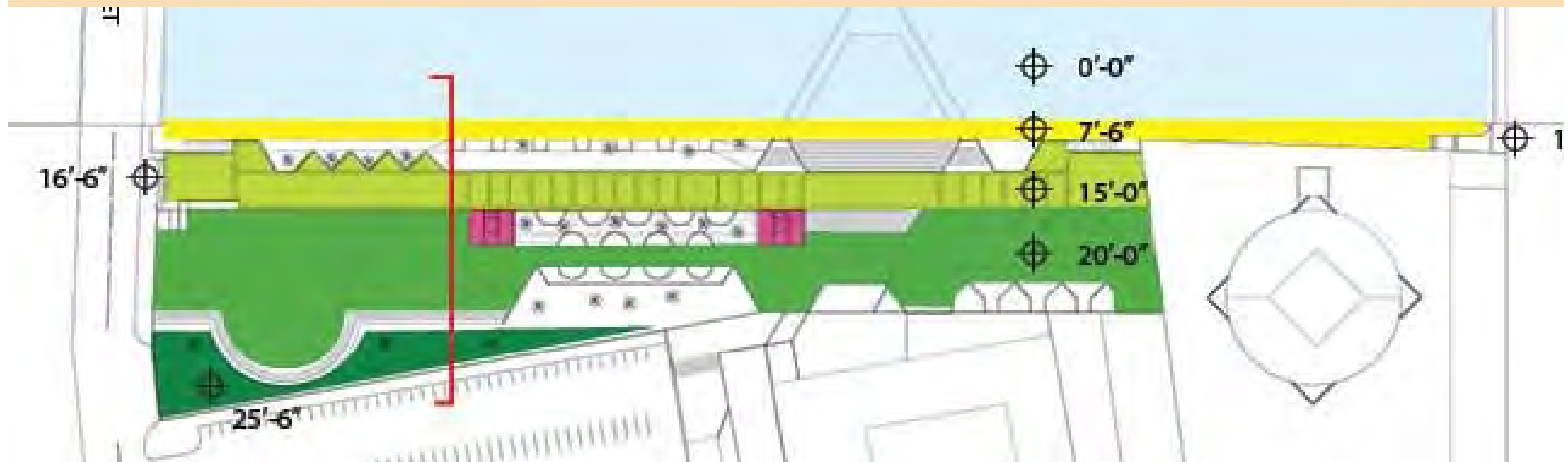
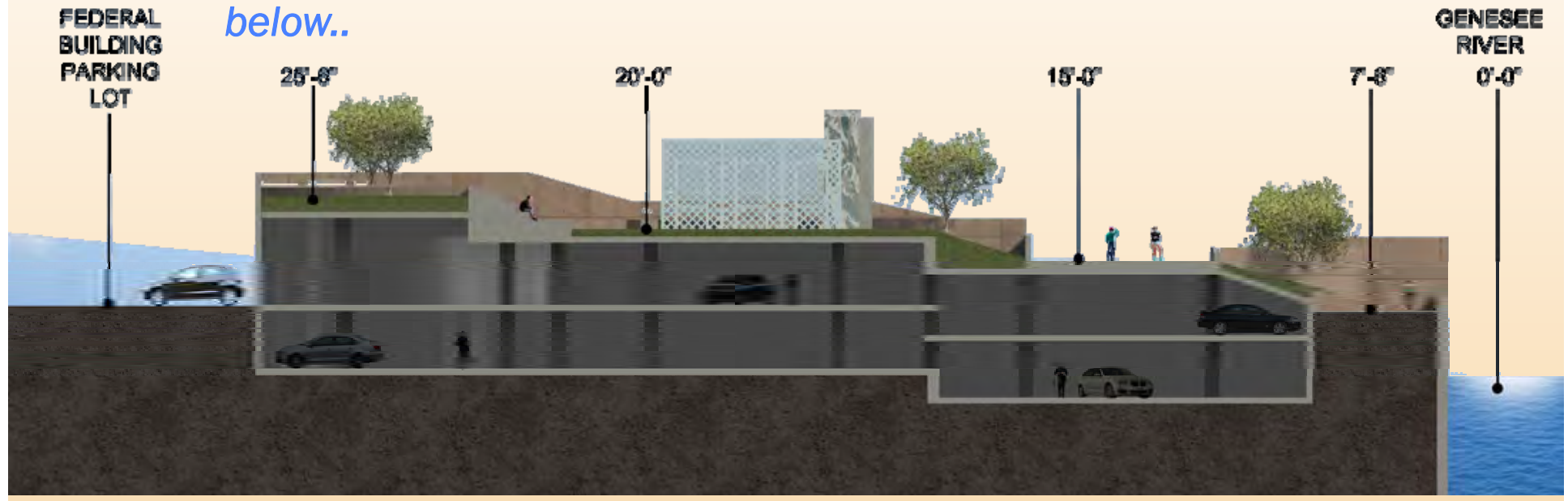
- ☐ Pedestrian access from Main, Andrews & State streets


The plaza is tiered with multiple levels that directly reflect the shape of the multi-storied Genesee Crossroads Parking Garage below..

PUBLIC FEEDBACK - WHAT WE HEARD...

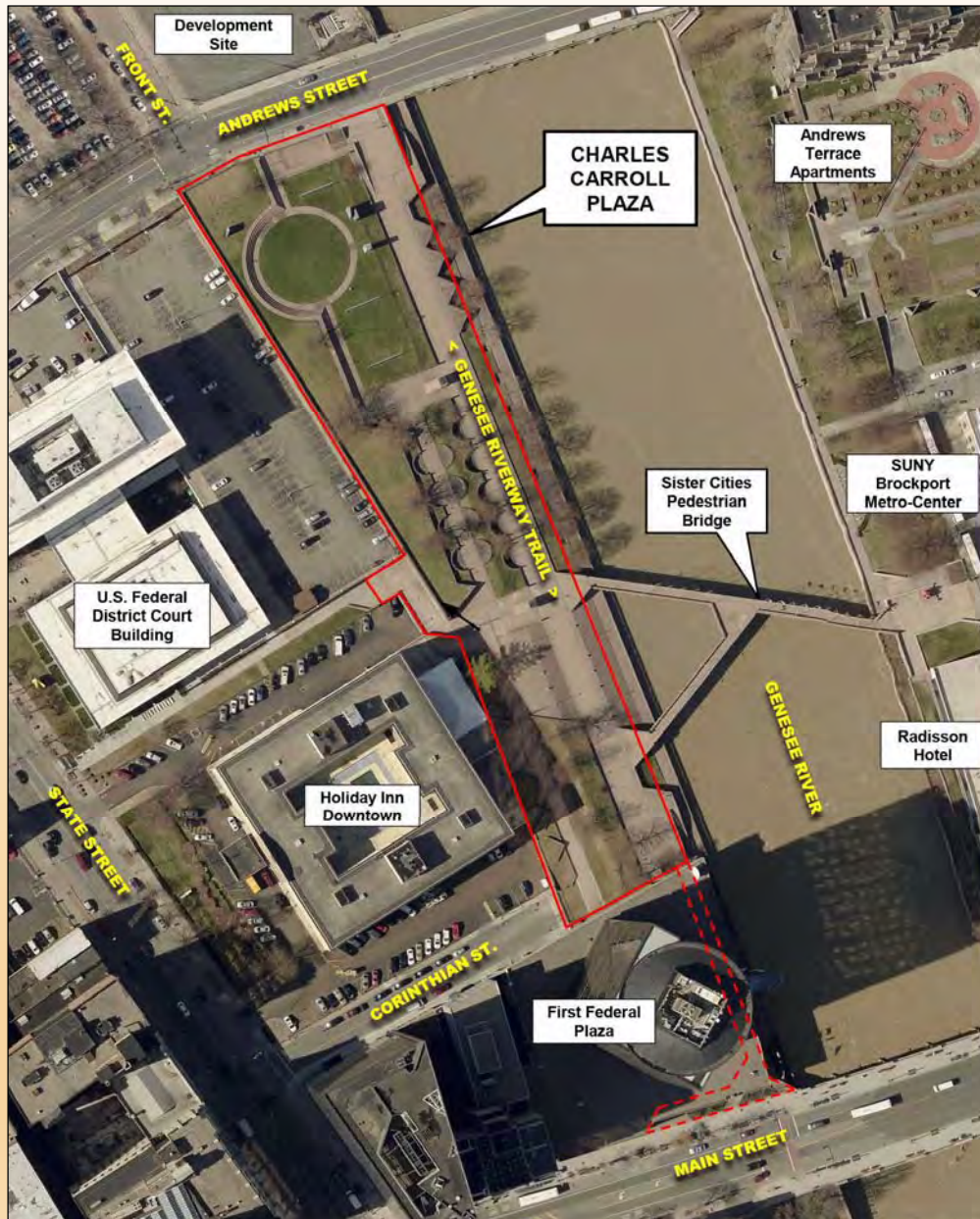
Responses overwhelmingly support maintaining the identity of this waterfront public space and making it a brighter, safer, more accessible version of itself.

Charles Carroll Park: A fully accessible park for public recreational use that provides spectacular river views, gathering areas, seating, promenades, programming opportunities, shared use bicycle and pedestrian trails, and green space.



- ❑ **SAFETY & SECURITY:** Reduce walls and hidden alcoves, improve lighting, use creative design to increase openness & perception of safety





- ❑ **CONNECTIVITY / ACCESS:**
Create ADA and bicycle accessible linkages to create an improved pedestrian network; reduce tripping hazards (pavers) & stairs.
- ❑ Improve connectivity to State Street

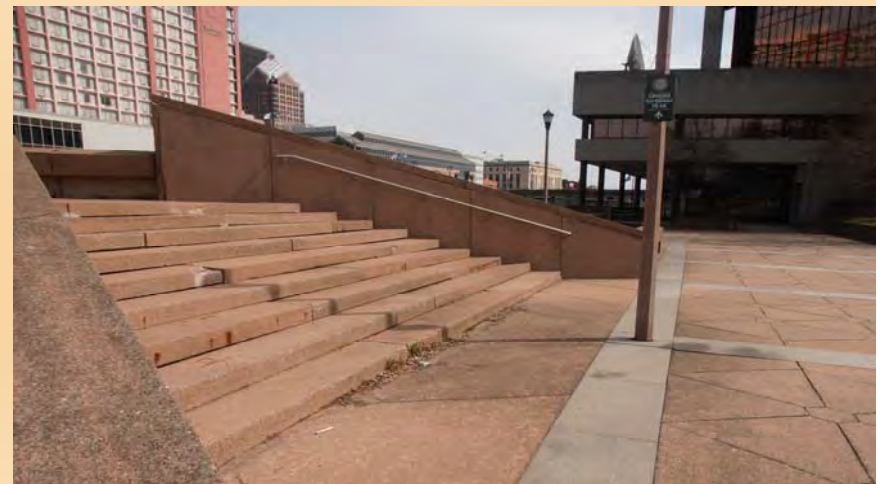


❑ **ACCESS CHALLENGES:**

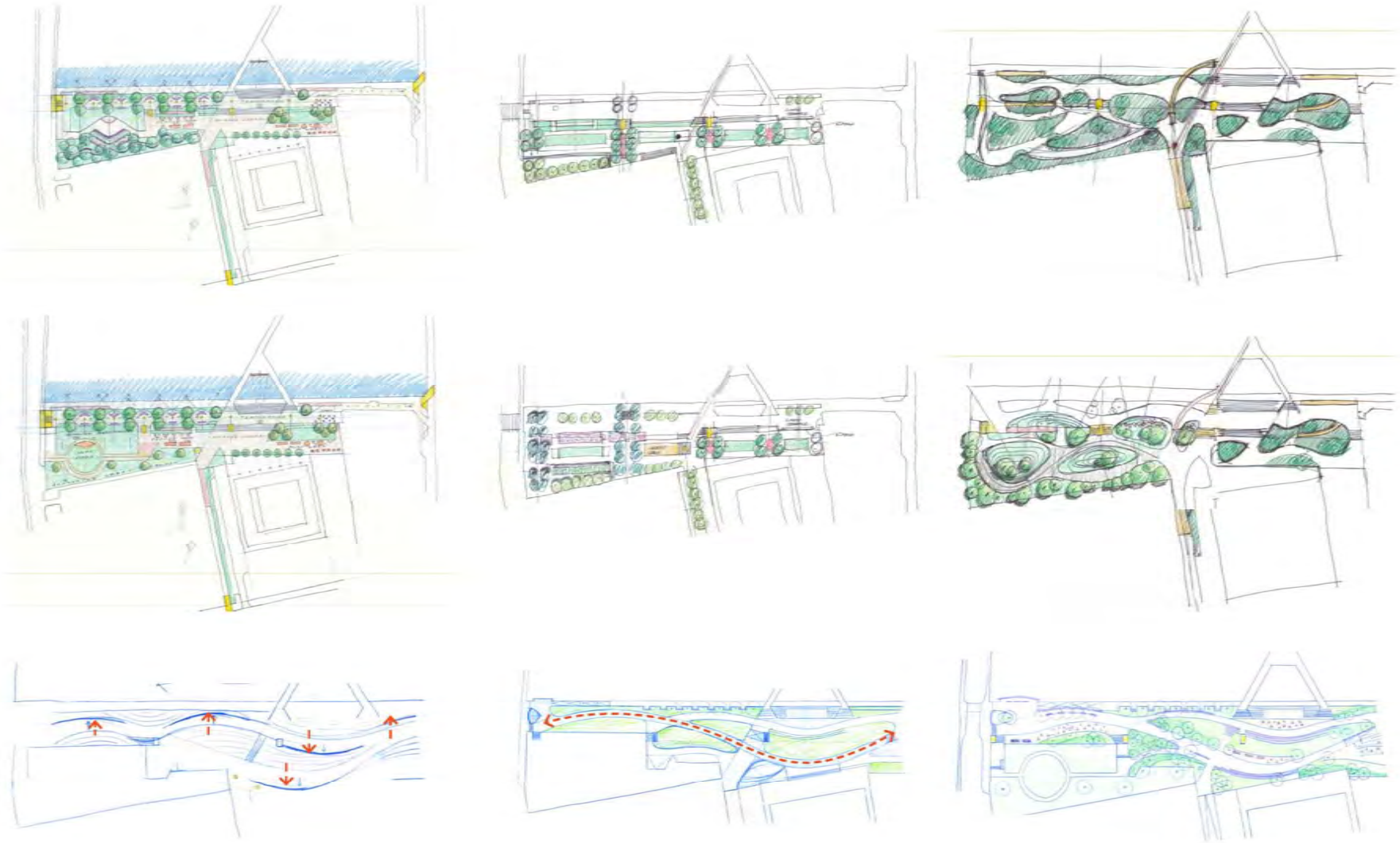

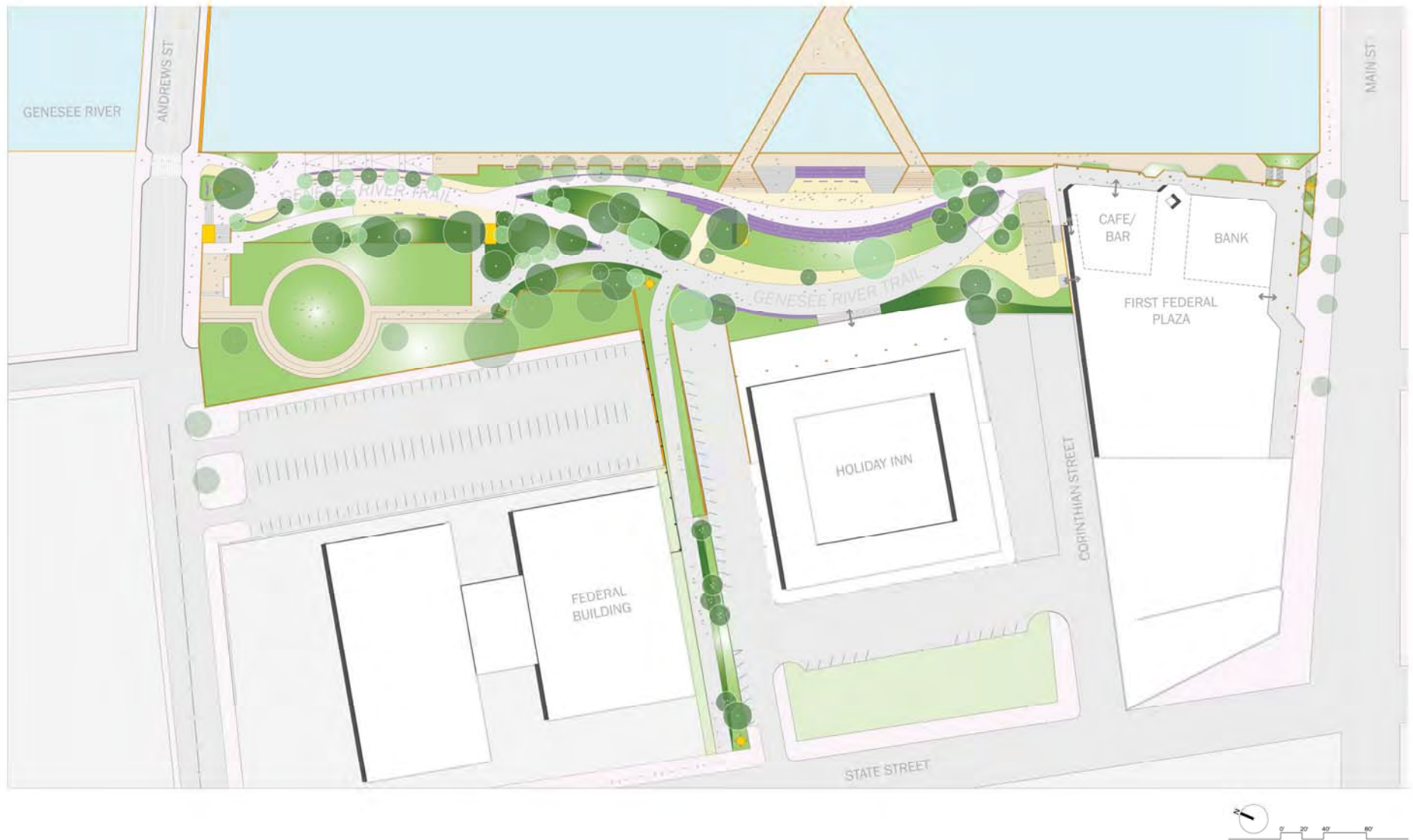

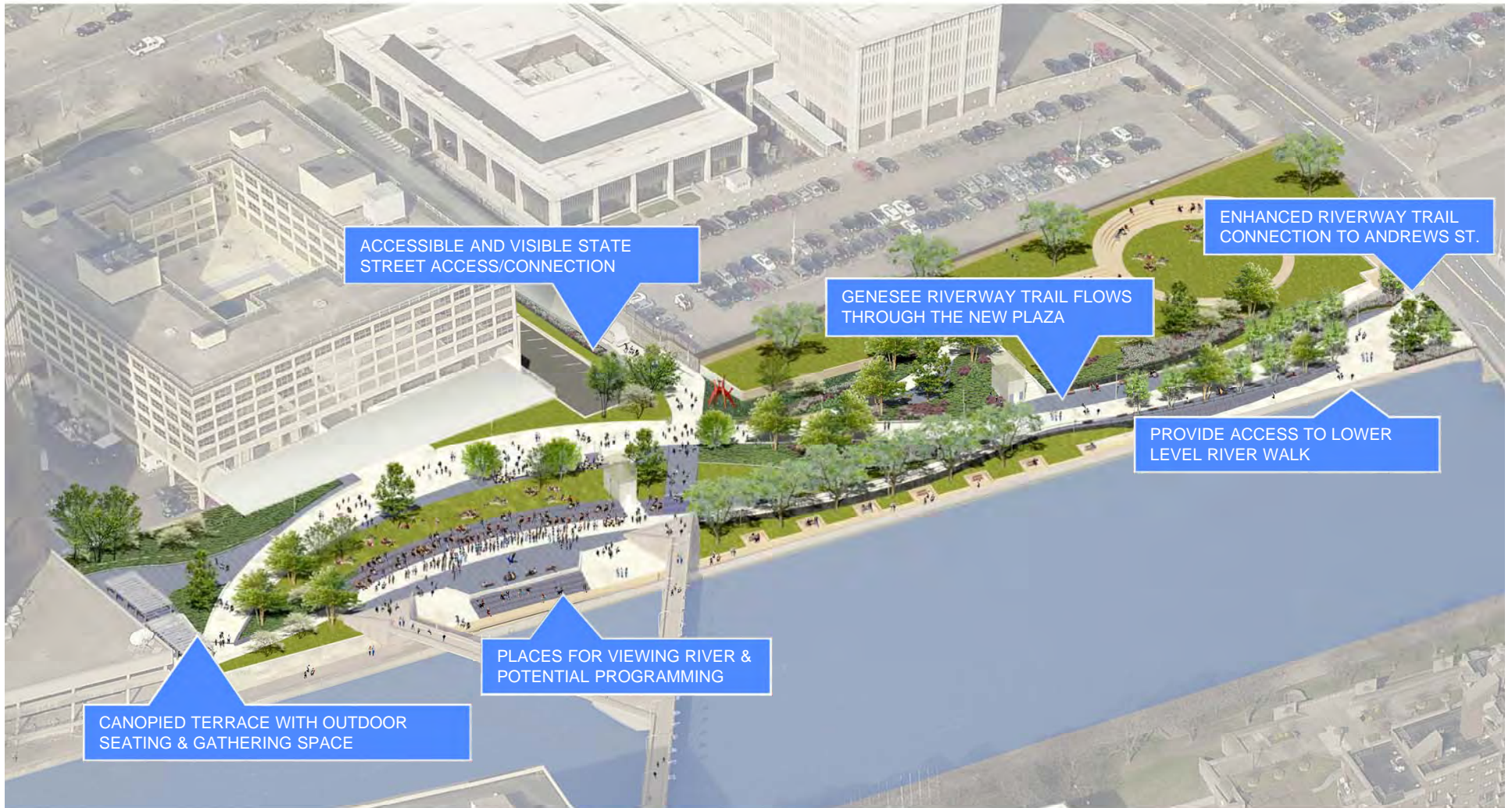
'GENESEE FLOW' SCHEMATIC CONCEPT - PLAN



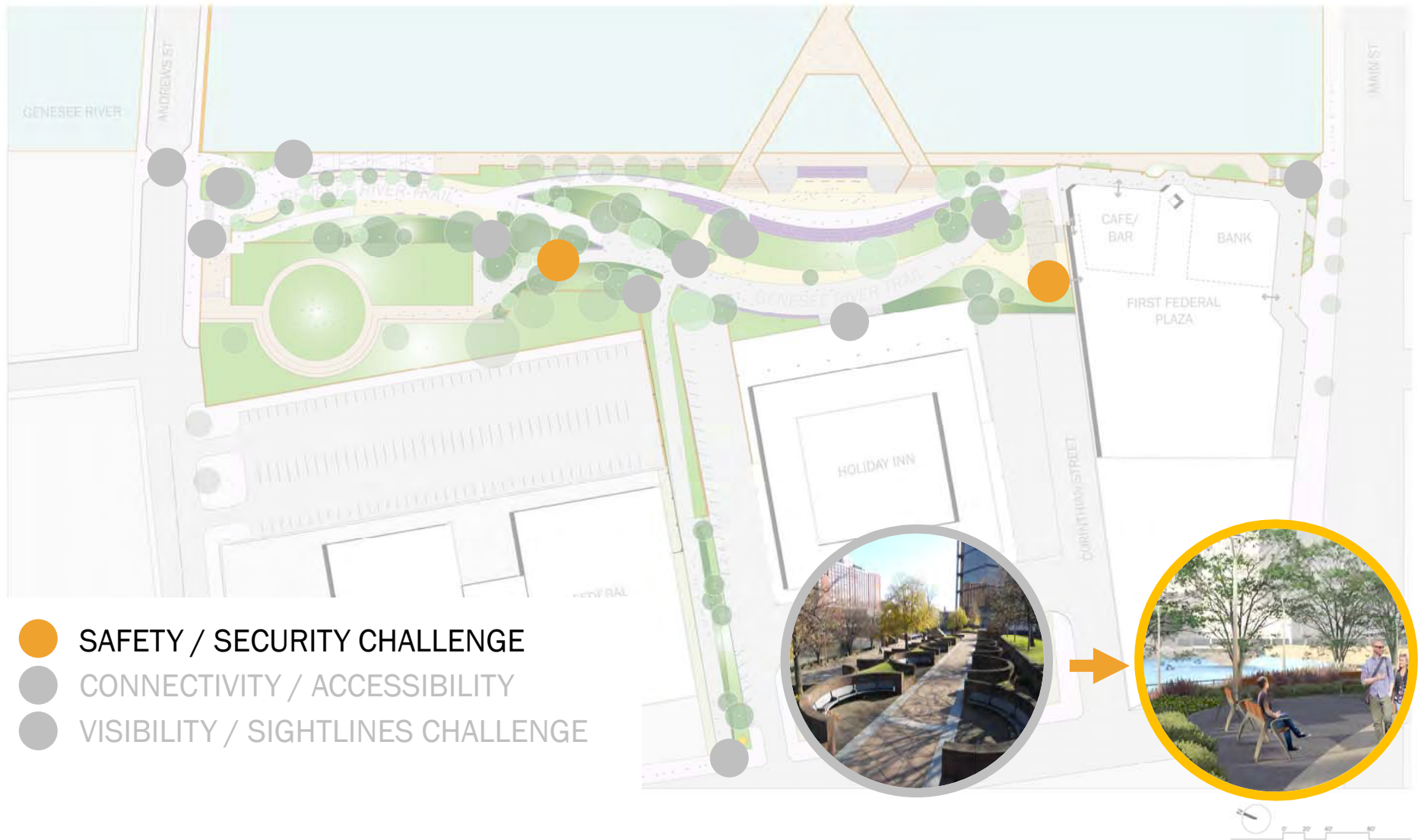

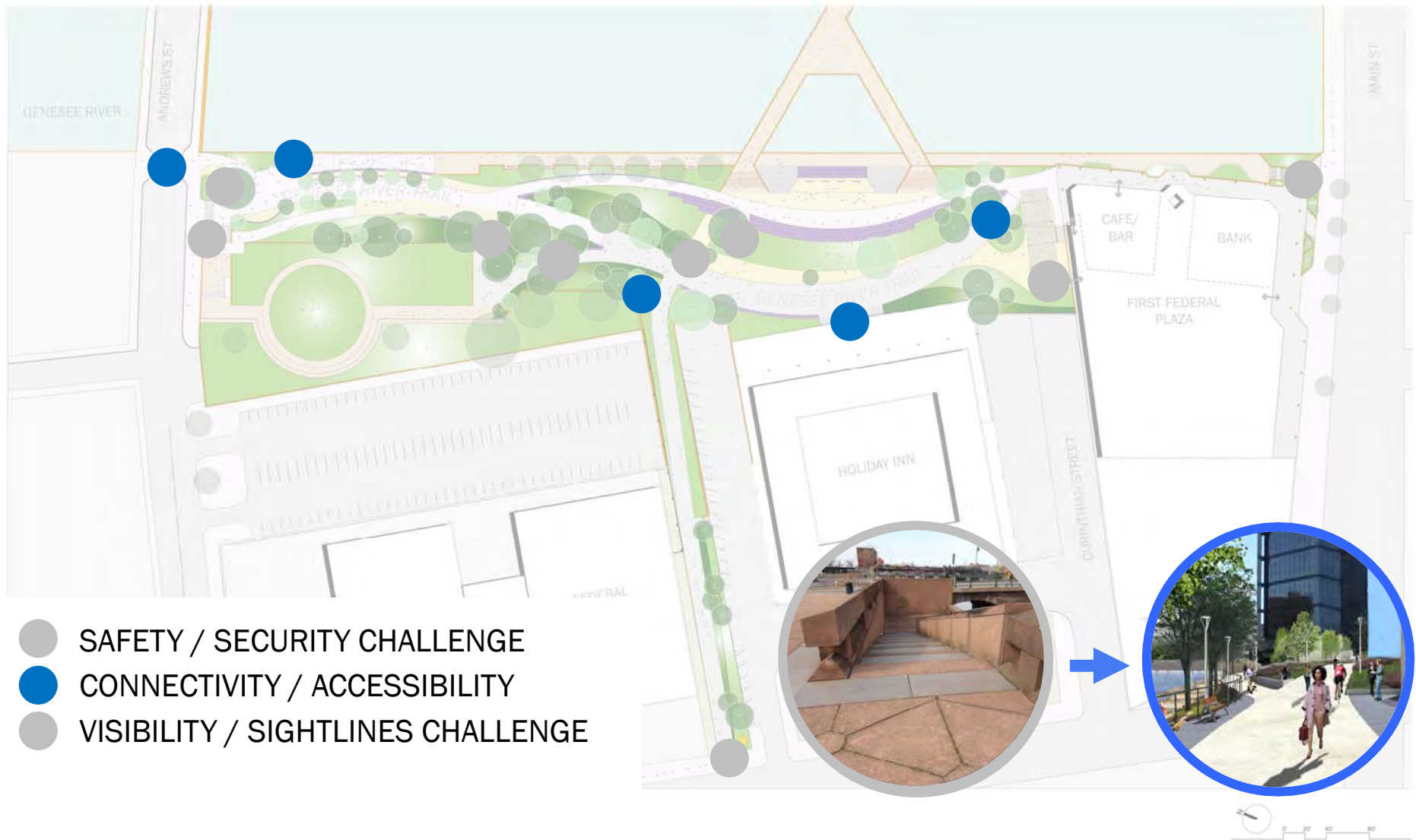

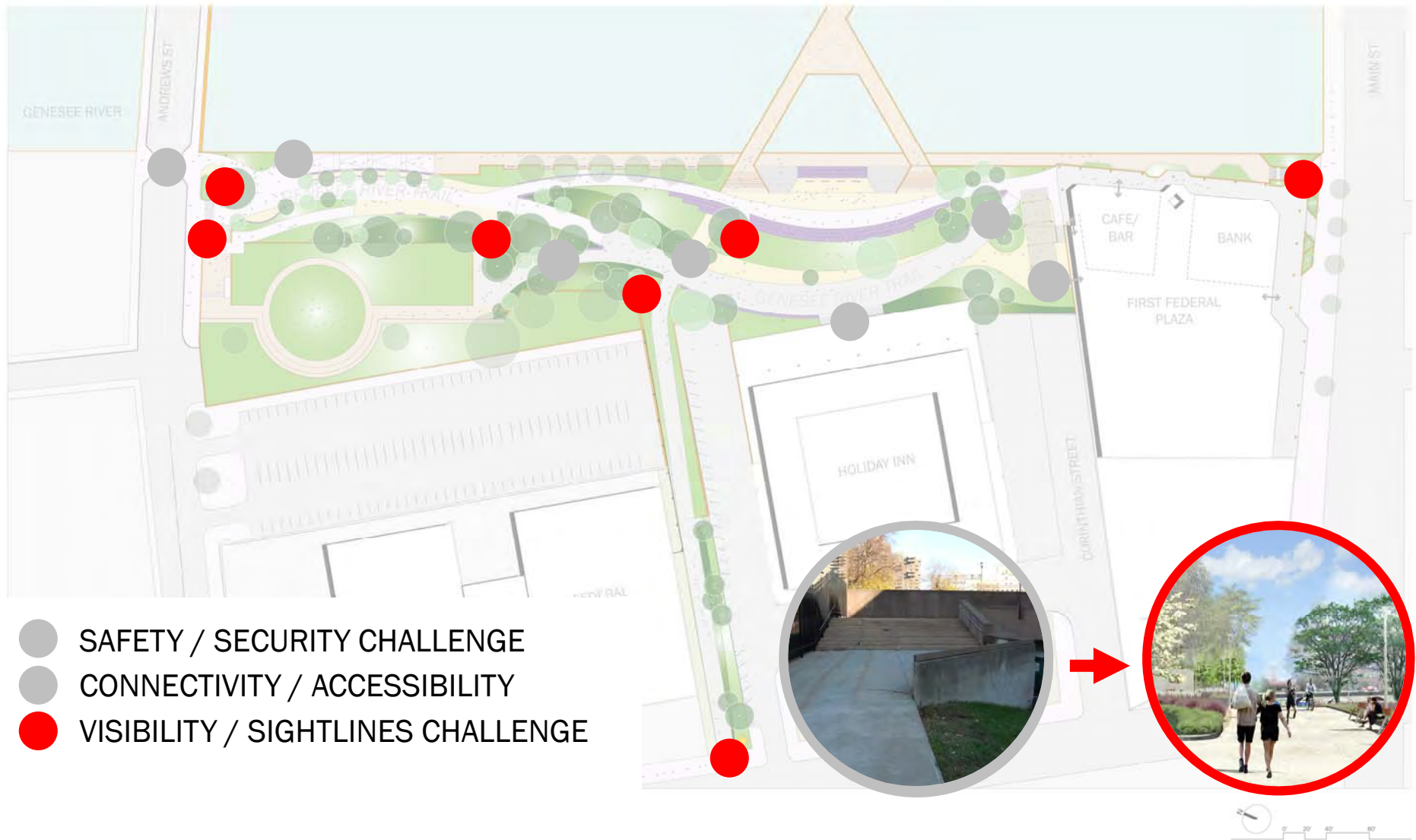

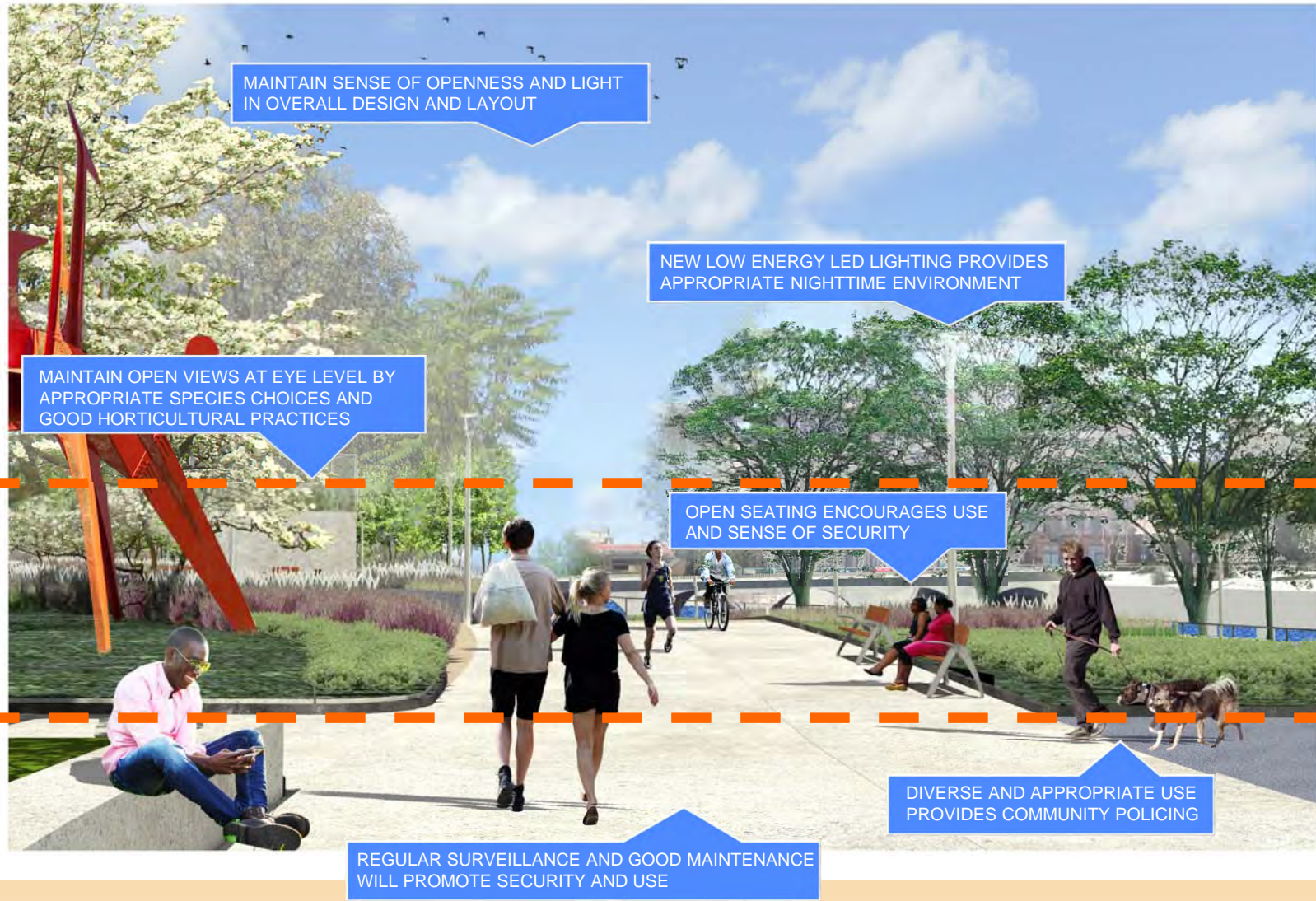

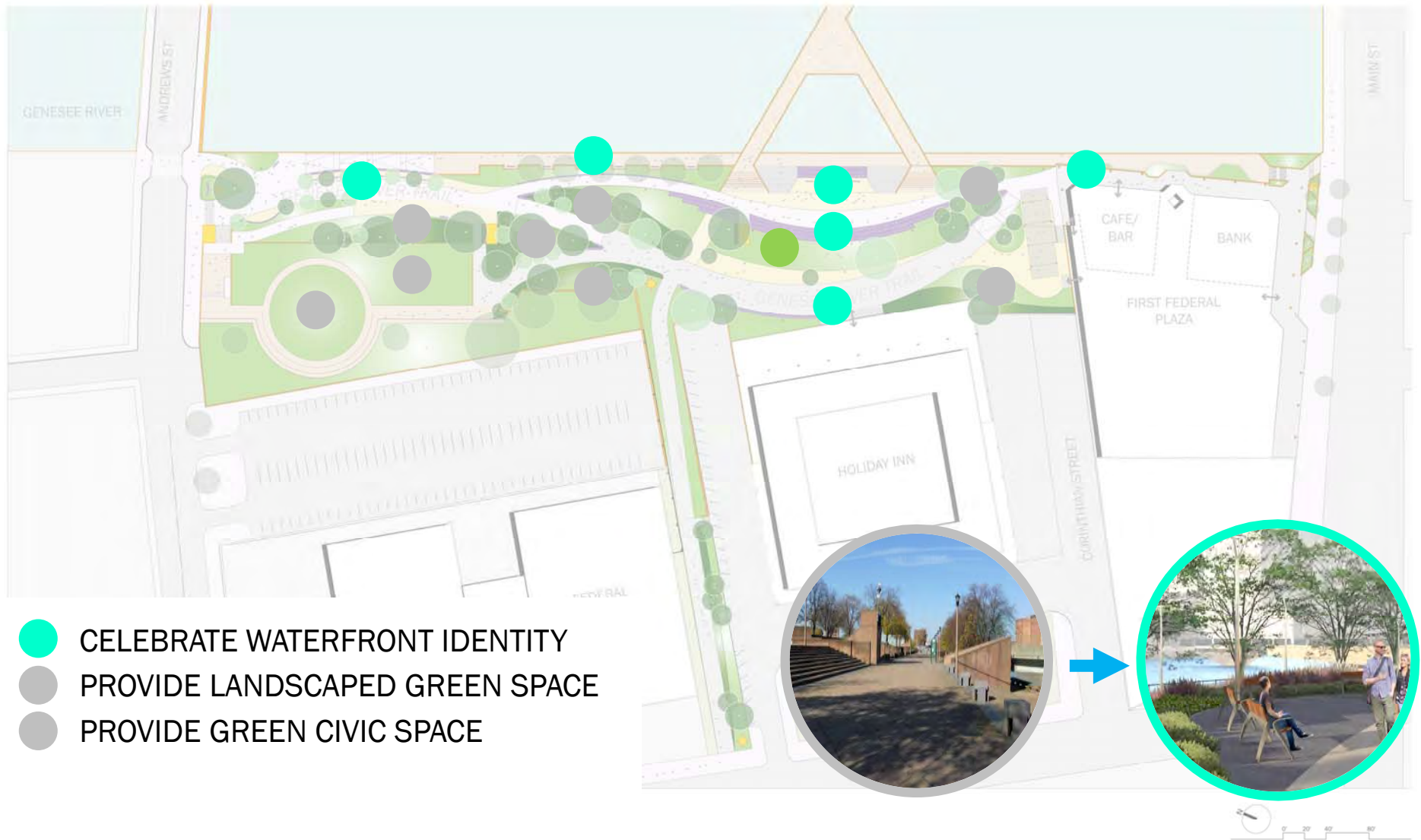

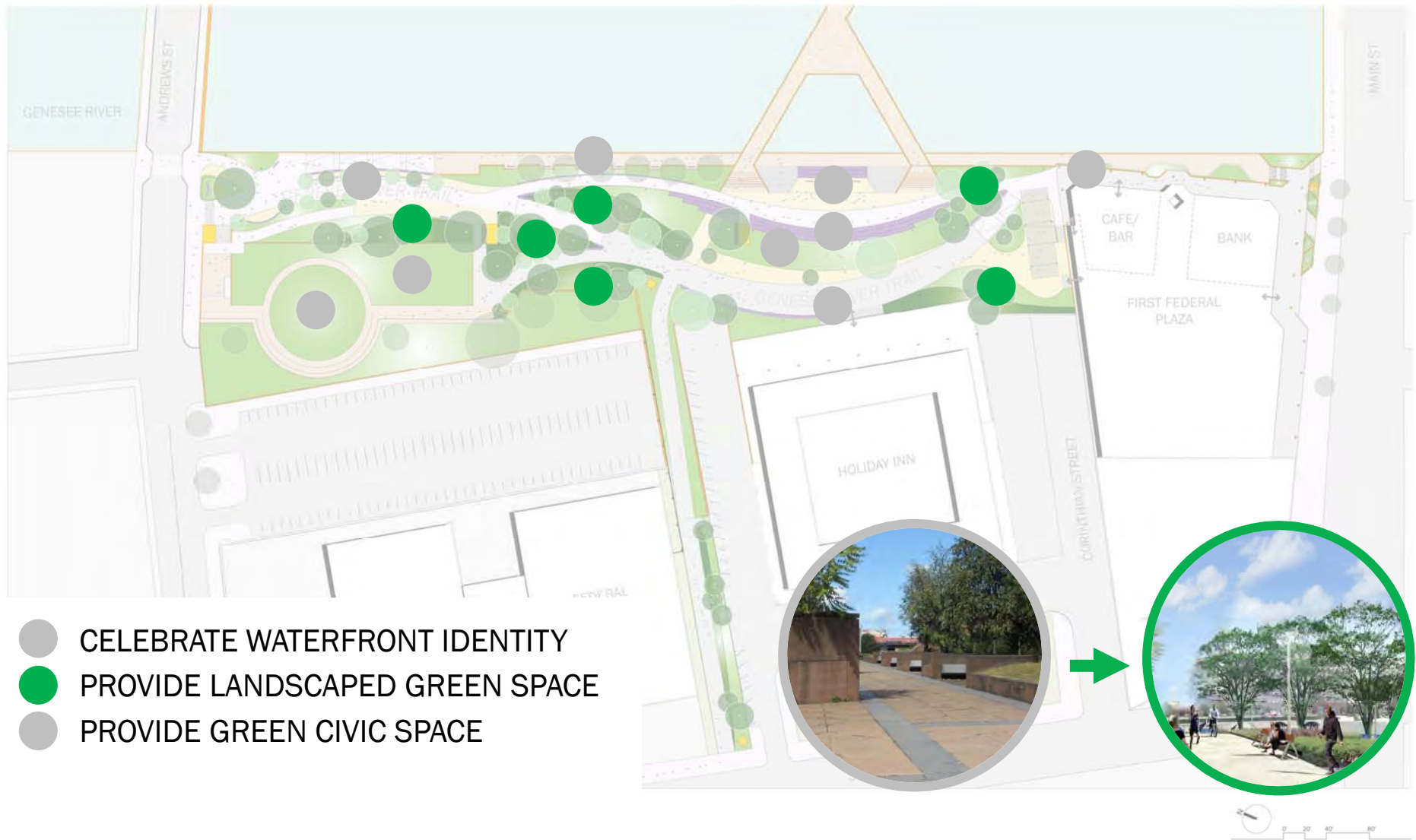

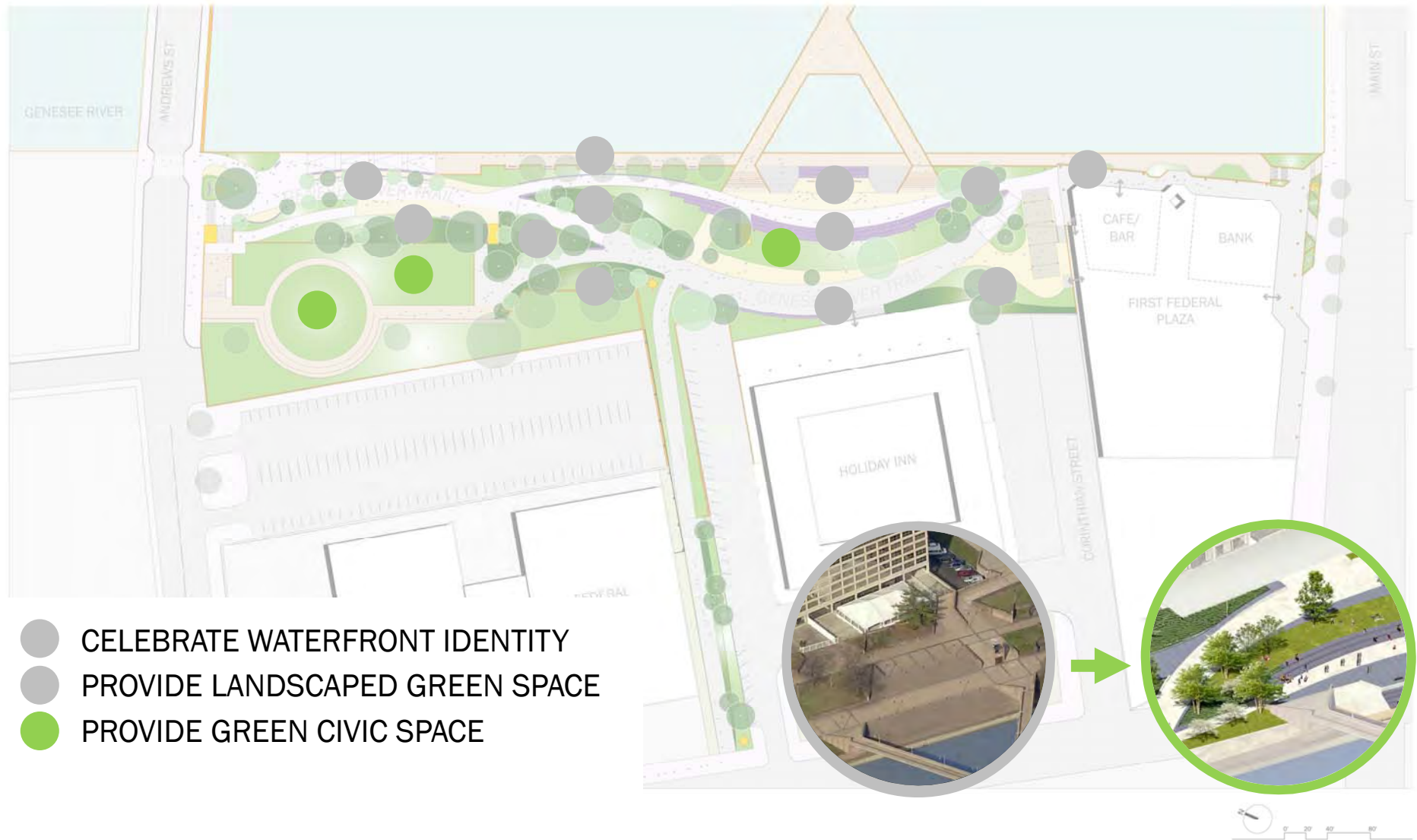

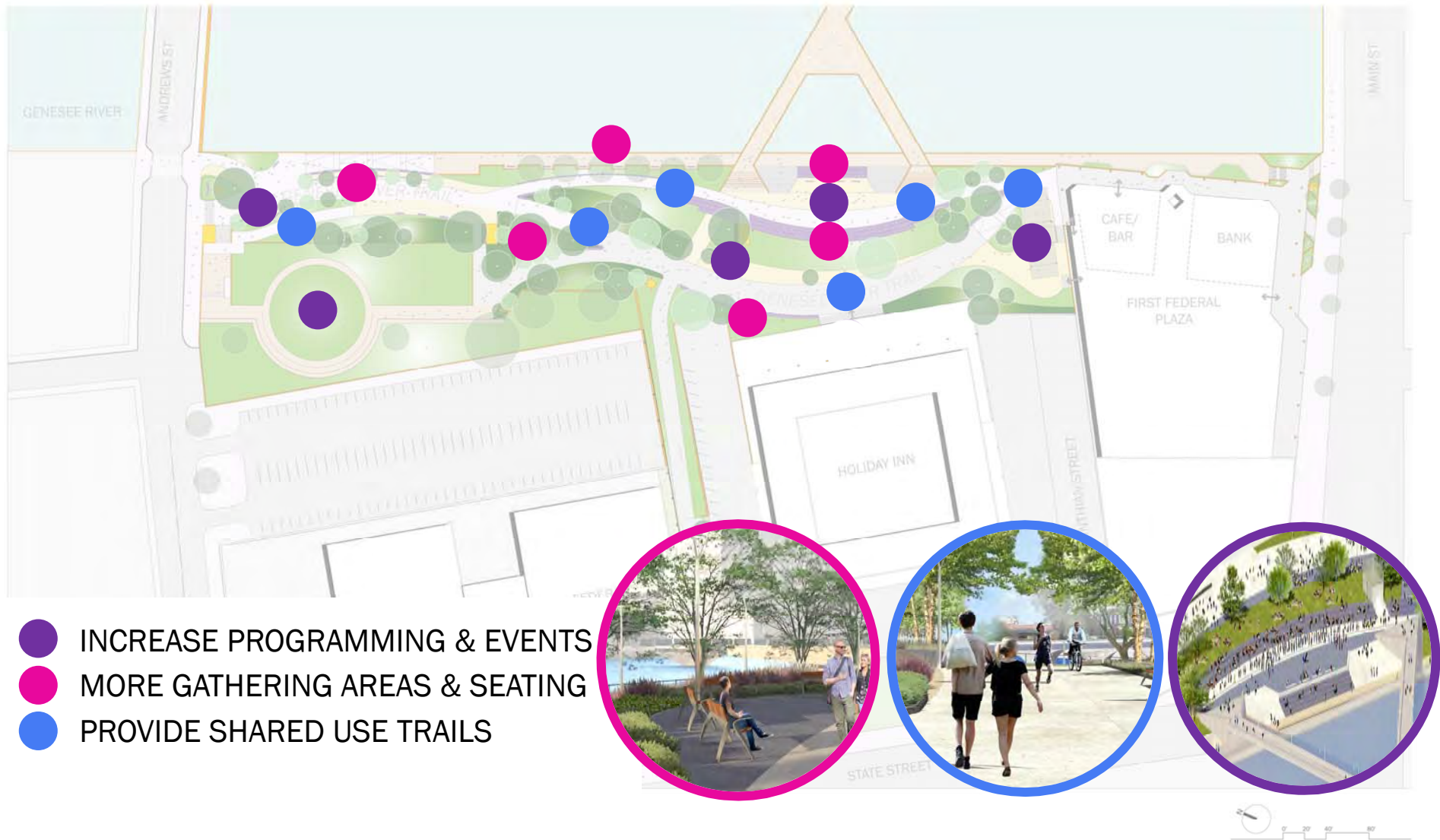

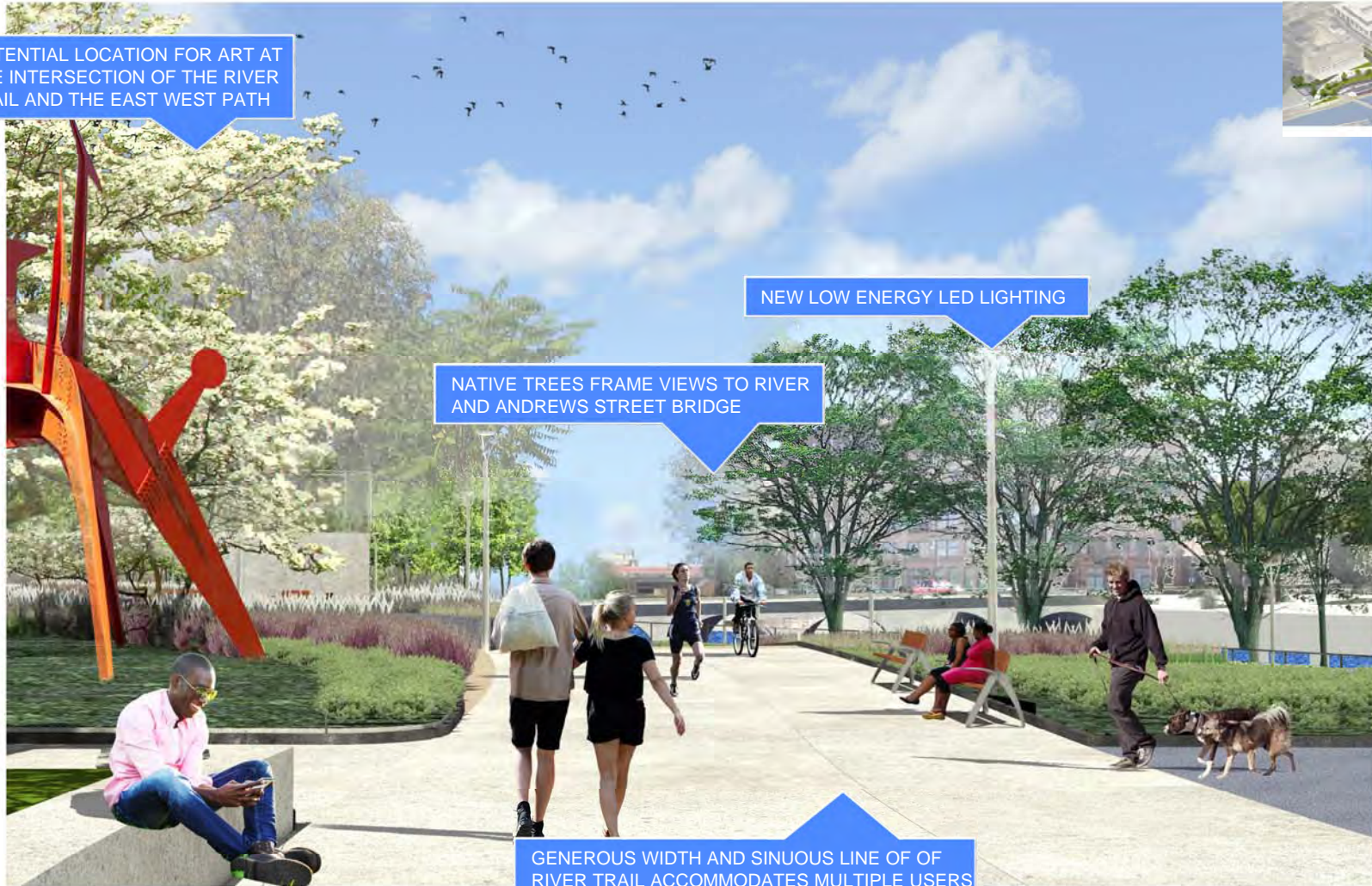

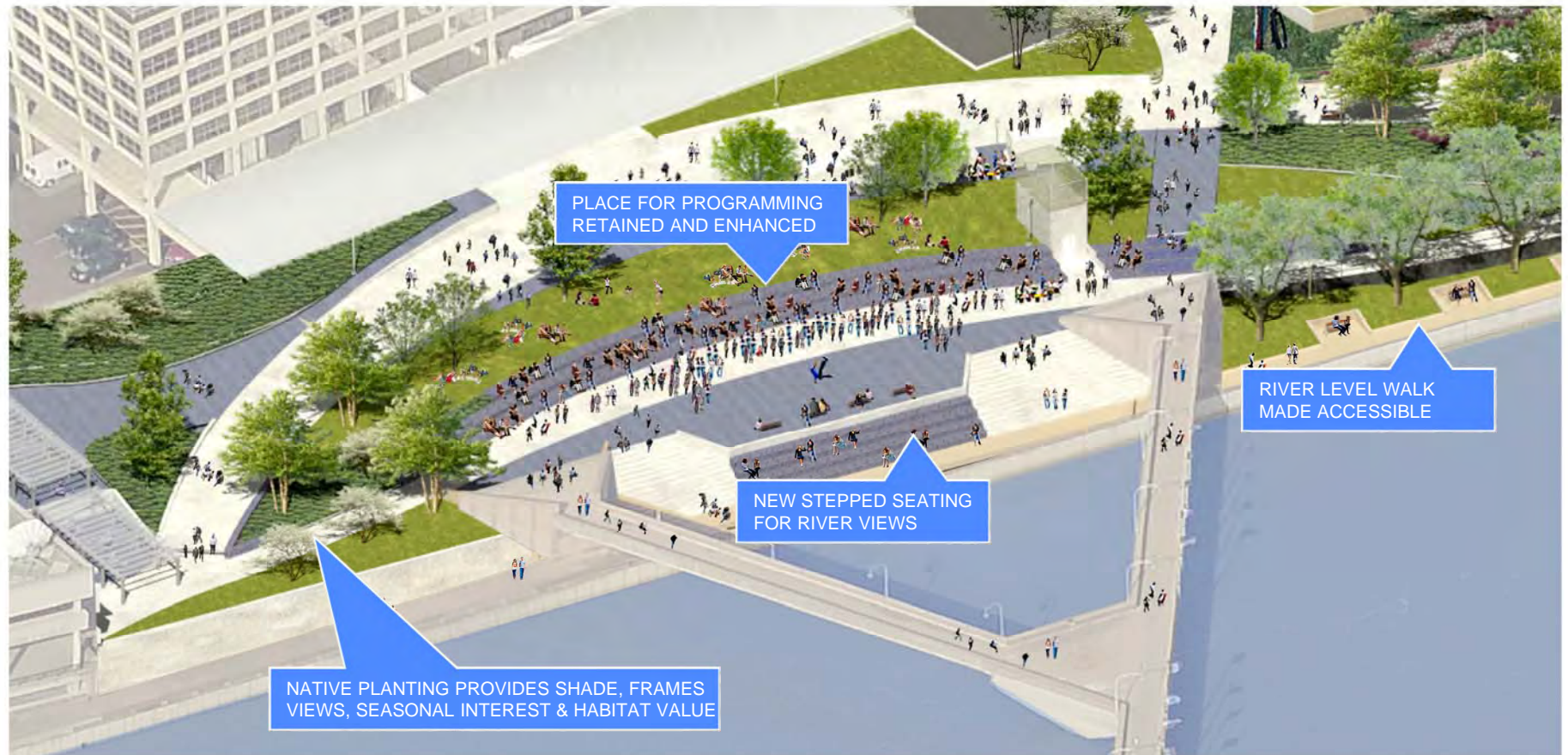
